SAE

A Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) is a student-led, instructor-supervised, work-based learning experience that results in measurable outcomes within a predefined, agreed upon set of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources (AFNR) Technical Standards and Career Ready Practices aligned to a students Career Plan of study.

Through their experiences in an SAE, students are eligible for awards & recognition at the local, state and national level, giving them an advantage when they enter the workforce. Students are also eligible for a variety of grants & support for starting businesses, implementing research projects or spearheading community service efforts.

An exploration of the daily impact of agriculture. This course introduces students to the plants, resources, energy, and animals we use and consume due to agricultural technologies.

Everyday is filled with hands-on, engaging activities for students to explore the incredible world of ag, food, fiber & natural resources.

In this class, students are exposed to the mechanics, power, technology, and career options in the world of agriculture. Students participating in the APT course will experience mechanical and engineering concepts with exciting hands-on activities, with two to three labs per week. Students will acquire the basic skills to operate, repair, engineer, and design agricultural tools and equipment.

Get hands-on with livestock in this course exploring the production and processing of cattle and livestock products. Students learn about the selection, care and management of livestock as well as the processing of animal products. Be ready to make cheese and ice cream, create a designer burger, felt wool and learn techniques for preparing the many cuts of meats.

Introduces students to business management in agriculture. Throughout the course are practical and engaging activities, projects, and problems to develop and improve business and employability skills. Additionally, students investigate and develop viable business plans in order to solve local problems. The business plan ideas are communicated to student peers and members of the professional community.

Member Leadership Series Conference (Syracuse, NY) - January 28-29
