Welcome fall! It seems the warm, albeit wet, summer days have given way to chilly evenings and foggy mornings. The school year is off and running! What a tremendous opening we had this year. It is great to have the staff and students back in the buildings. When you visit our campus, please notice the newly painted halls, shiny floors and refinished gymnasium floors. The maintenance staff did a phenomenal job readying our buildings for the new school year. Our sports teams are enjoying much success and the district is offering FREE breakfast for all students for the entire school year.

The summer has been tremendously busy here at school. Many staff members were busy learning new programs and writing curriculum. The District's goal is to create a consistent, aligned ELA program for all of our students to enjoy success. We welcome your input regarding both of these programs during the school year.

Also new this year at the elementary level our students in grades K-3 will be learning a new handwriting program called, *Handwriting without Tears*. This is a writing program developed to strengthen students' fine motor skills and aid in the development of hand writing.

We are very proud of our new Facebook page. Please *like* us on Facebook and keep up on the latest school information, closings and photos. We also do a *Flashback Friday* section on Facebook to reminisce about the good old days and remember our students and staff from the years past. This is another avenue for the school, parents and community members to better communicate. Also this year I will begin to use Twitter as a way to share many of the great things happening at B-G. At Bainbridge-Guilford Jr.-Sr. High, 2016-2017 was another very successful school year. Our Regents results were exceptional with overall passing rates in the high 80's and 90's and five of the 10 at 100% passing rates! Between four Advanced Placement Tests, our results had 40 out of 49 students earn a three or above! Five students earned Associate's Degrees from TC3 with many more seniors earning college credits. Our graduation rate was 93% and our school earned the honor of the Scholar Athlete School of Excellence Award by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association. We are very proud of our students, staff and community for working together to achieve such outstanding accomplishments.

To begin this new year we welcome new teachers in the areas of Physical Education (Mr. Andrew Golden), in Science (Mr. Daren Terpstra), in Special Education (Mr. Nate Ford), and in Technology (Mr. Philip Bianchi). We have two new aides with Ms. Melissa Morlano-Johnson working in the Main Office focusing on school attendance and Mr. Michael Davidson who will be aiding teachers and students in a variety of classes. Additionally, we have two new Custodial Workers who are both on second shift, Mr. Scott Nowak and Mr. Ron Palmatier.

Another new member to our building is our therapy dog in training, Tucker, who will be stationed in the Guidance Office. Tucker is a three and half month old Australian Shepard. He is owned by our school counselor Ms. Nanci Miller. Tucker is being trained to be a therapy dog and provide affection and comfort to students in our school. As you can imagine, Tucker has already made many new friends.

Also new this school year, our Marching Band revealed their new uniforms at last year's rescheduled Memorial Day Parade. Along with their exceptional performance, the band was very stylish and more comfortable in their modern marching band apparel. The new design incorporated logos from year's past on flashy blue and white colors. The Band and Color Guard also have a new banner to lead the way.

We are excited to begin another school year and look forward to educating our students academically, physically and emotionally. We welcome our new staff and always share that we have a wonderful staff and great students. 
and boots. We try to get children outside every day, especially in the winter snow




District Receives Funds

Request for Pesticide Application Notice

October 2017

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff,

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Bainbridge-Guilford Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hour following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;

- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

The Bainbridge-Guilford Central School will not allow the use of any pesticides that require notification unless an emergency exists. In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your school, please complete the form below and return it to the school. AHERA Notification

The Bainbridge-Guilford Central School District has completed the inspection of its facilities to determine if asbestos is present and if any action is needed to avoid potential health hazards.

A management plan has been developed in compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Alert (AHERA) to insure that the school district continues to provide and maintain a safe environment for students, employees and visitors.

THE PLAN INCLUDES:

- Training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos
- Provisions for periodic re-inspection and surveillance
- Provisions for abatement activities performed by trained personnel

Annually school districts are required to notify parent, teacher, and employee organizations of the availability of their management plans.

Adult Basic Education/ High School Equivalency




Afton Adult Education sponsors two classes per week in many area schools and libraries. You may join a class at any time. Classes are free, and work is individualized.
