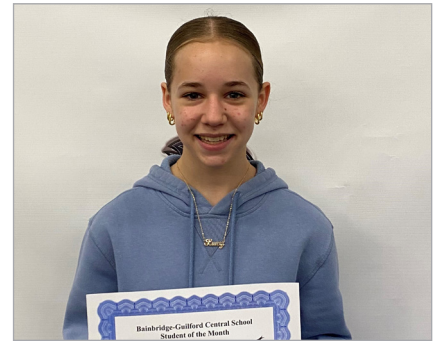

We have had another great school year! As we wind down, we have finished Jr. High State Assessments and have begun Regents Exams. Our musical groups competed at the Sherburne Pageant of Bands and placed in every category. Two students earned their FFA Blue Jackets. Our Honors Reception recognized 247 students in grades 7th through 12th who made honor roll for the first three grading quarters. We had four students sign certificates of employment through their BOCES CTE programs to work at Raymond and one to work for the Village of Bainbridge Department of Public Works. We recognized 300 varsity letter winners at our Athletic Awards with the majority of our teams having winning records. All our varsity teams achieved NYS Scholar Athlete Team status and four teams (Girl's Cross Country, Girl's Indoor Track, Boy's Outdoor Track and Girl's Outdoor Track) won Section IV Championships, an amazing accomplishment!
