

From the Superintendent

We did it! After six months of speculation, planning and hard work, the Bainbridge-Guilford Central School District successfully opened its doors to students again on Thursday, September 10, 2020. This fall we welcomed 81% of our student body back to campus, and 19% of our students are learning remotely from home. BG is using a "hybrid" model this fall which means we have some students learning at home fully virtual, and the remaining students are split into group A and group B with each group on campus for two days of in-person instruction and home for 3 days of virtual instruction. Since virtual and in-person instruction occur daily, the district has the ability to switch to full virtual instruction at home if weather conditions or an increase in COVID cases warrants it. Currently, Wednesday is being used for "deep cleaning" all of the classrooms and areas of the buildings, as well as office hours for students, AIS support and advanced and college classes. BG has about 350 students on campus at one time. We are maintaining social distancing and all students and staff wear masks.

Our three year Capital Project is winding down with just a few finishing touches left. Please notice the return and restoration of the historic lights in front of Guilford elementary. These lights are nearly 100 years old and were originally gas. They have been converted to electric and will now light the way for another 100 years. They have been painstakingly restored in Cooperstown.

While we will continue to offer meals to students for the days that they are not on campus, meal delivery will not be available starting November 1, 2020. Please contact Billie Reigles at 967-6331 to enroll in curbside pick-up meals at either Greenlawn Elementary or Guilford Elementary on Wednesdays starting November 4, 2020.

You may have heard that school districts in New York State are facing possible aid reductions of 20% for the current school year. For BG, this equates to around \$2.4 million dollars. If this occurs, this will be a huge hit to our district. The board of education, district finance committee and administrators are currently meeting to determine the best course of action for our district. Please look for more information on our possible aid loss in the very near future.

Student screening prior to entering the school buildings remains a priority. Recently, we have launched the APP in Powerschool to complete the student screening process. More information on how to access this application, is available on the Technology page of the BG website. We appreciate your efforts to keep our students and staff safe.

Enjoy the upcoming autumn and cooler temps. While not a traditional school year at BG, it will still be a great one! Proud to be a Bobcat!

At Bainbridge-Guilford Jr.-Sr. High, 2019-2020 ended in a crazy fashion with the Pandemic fully upon us. We persevered and did our best to finish out the year. Though our students lost many recognition activities and spring sports, we pulled through in the very end with a somewhat normal graduation ceremony on our front lawn. Our seniors actually had two graduation ceremonies as we completed a virtual one as a precautionary measure in the event we could not have our traditional front lawn ceremony. Our seniors deserve great accolades for ending strong in under such strange circumstances and by finishing with one of our highest graduation rates! Way to go Class of 2020!

To begin the 2020-2021 school year, as we continue to adapt to learning in a new way, we first welcome new staff; Ms. Melissa Epps in Special Education, Ms. Christine Gaias who is an LTA transferring from Greenlawn, Mr. Christopher Jones in Math who will be a long term substitute, Mr. Richard DeLousia in Music who will be a long term substitute, Ms. Melissa Baker who is a Teacher's Aide and Ms. Elizabeth Prezorski who is also a Teacher's Aide.

We have started the school year in a hybrid learning model where about a third of our students come on Monday and Tuesday, a third come on Thursday and Friday and a third are learning from home in a total remote format. With our Chromebooks, students are learning via Google Classroom and through Zoom participation when they learn from home.

It has been about six months since our students were in the building and when they returned this September, they found our building nearing the end of Phase Two of the Capital Project. Our students have new hallway lockers, many doors have been replaced, our gyms and second floor rooms now have climate control to keep them cooler. The Fitness Center and Functional Fitness Room are completed and look amazing!

We are excited to begin another school year and to have our students back in our building. As always, we look forward to educating our students academically, physically and emotionally. We welcome our new team members and always boast that we have great staff and great students! With the many opportunities given to our students and continued support from our community we will again achieve great things throughout the school year. As we navigate through this stressful and unpredictable health emergency, more than ever we all need to work together to keep our students, staff and families healthy.

AHERA Notification

The Bainbridge-Guilford Central School District has completed the inspection of its facilities to determine if asbestos is present and if any action is needed to avoid potential health hazards.

A management plan has been developed in compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Alert (AHERA) to insure that the school district continues to provide and maintain a safe environment for students, employees and visitors.

THE PLAN INCLUDES

- Training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos;
- Provisions for periodic re-inspection and surveillance; provisions for abatement activities performed by trained personnel.
- Annually school districts are required to notify parent, teacher, and employee organizations of the availability of their management plans.

A copy of the management plan is available for inspection at the Main Office of the High School and Guilford as well as at the Director of Facilities Office at Greenlawn. Any questions regarding this matter may be directed to James Rideout, Director of Facilities II at 967-6322.

Adult Basic Education/ High School Equivalency

Are you interested in earning a high school equivalency diploma, or improving your reading, writing and math skills? There are free, educational services available through Afton Central School's Adult and Continuing Education program.

Afton Adult Education sponsors two classes per week in many area schools and libraries. You may join a class at any time. Classes are free, and work is individualized.

For those unable to attend a class, there is a program offered through the mail called GRASP (Giving Ready Adults a Study Program). This program is designed for motivated people 21 years of age or older who work well on their own and possess good reading skills.

Additionally, individuals who have passed regents examinations in English language arts, mathematics, science and social studies can substitute those passing scores for a maximum of four of the five corresponding Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASCTM) subtests: reading, writing, math, science, and social studies.

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff,

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Whenever possible, the application of non-exempt pesticides will be conducted when the building will be unoccupied for a continuous 72-hour period following the application.

The Bainbridge-Guilford Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

This prohibition of the use of pesticides does not apply to indoor use of pesticides or pesticide application to buildings and structures (e.g. school buildings, garages).

The following types of pesticides and alternatives are allowable on playing fields and playgrounds:

- · Antimicrobial pesticides and products as defined in the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act;
- Aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of eighteen (18) fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects, including venous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets;
- Non-volatile insect or rodent bait in tamper resistant containers;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- Pesticides classified as exempt material by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) under 40 CFR part 152.25;
- Horticultural oils and soaps that do not contain synthetic pesticides or synergists.

The Bainbridge-Guilford Central School will not allow the use of any pesticides that require notification unless an emergency exists. In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your school, please complete the form below and return it to the school. Powerschool Daily Screening

Our Daily Health Screening is now up-and-running through Powerschool. Please follow the directions on our Technology Page to set-up your Powerschool account. You will be able to link all of your students to your account. Account access codes have been sent home with your students. Every day, please go to "forms" on the left hand side of your account and fill-out the form for each student prior to attendance each day. If you are having any trouble with this form, please continue to fill-out the Daily Health Screening on our website. We will run both of these screenings at the same time for a limited amount of time until we can transition everyone to the Powerschool form.

B-G Re-Opening 2020—Frequently Asked Questions!

- What if a parent has some of the symptoms of COVID?
 Please keep your child home until the parent has been seen by a physician.
- Can BOCES students self-transport all days?
 They can self-transport after filling out a permission form.
- IEP/Special Education Services-How is that all going to fit in two days of instruction?
- Any services that require in person will be held on the two days your child is on campus. Those services that can be completed virtually will occur on the other three days of the week.
- Can a parent revoke the in-school learning after it has begun if wearing a mask all day result in asthmatic complications?

Yes, you may switch your child to remote at any time. To come back to campus from remote, we as parents wait until the 10 week mark.

• For clarification—My 6th grader will be doing the hybrid. On the two days of virtual, she will be in child care where her provider is not going to be overseeing her virtual work. If she is unable to log-on, will she be penalized for attendance even though it appears she will be able to see the virtual lessons outside of the time of the live, on-line presentation, for example, later that evening or on the weekend? I don't understand how children at child care sites are going to be able to fulfill real time log on.

A student in 6th grade is expected to log on for her core classes each day while virtual. The district will work with the family if the child is unable to access the core classes live from time to time. Lessons will also be recorded.

- If a child who is participating in the hybrid option is sent home with suspected COVID, do they just move into the full virtual route while waiting for test results? Yes they do
- What changes after week 10?

We begin the second quarter of the school year, and a child could come to campus for the hybrid option if they have been home learning virtually.

 What happens to the other students/teachers if a student or adult does in fact test positive?

We alert the county of residence and the Department of Health beings contact tracing. This could result in a child(ren) being interviewed by the county. Parents will of course be alerted. The county then advises the district.

 For full virtual, would students attend synchronous for all days of instruction?

Students using the full virtual model will be expected to follow along during the core areas of instruction.

- How do they determine the source if a child or staff has symptoms or tests positive for COVID?
 We take the Department of Health's lead on this and they make those determinations.
- Will the children be offered Chromebook to use at home? Every student in grades 2-12 will be offered a Chromebook, while our students in grades preK-1 will be receiving iPads.
- Will students be recorded when doing virtual lessons?
 The teacher will be recorded teaching the lesson. It is possible some students voices will be in the recording.
- How is the cafeteria being set up for social distancing?

 Each building will be socially distancing the students while in the cafeteria. The Jr/Sr HS building will have desks instead of tables, all socially distanced and facing in the same direction. The elementary buildings will be marking off the tables.
- What about students doing full virtual that play sports or instruments

They are welcome to participate in athletics and extracurricular activities.

- What if my child has a cough but no other symptoms, will they need to be COVID tested in order to attend school? This is when your child's medical history will come into play. A conversation with the nurse, building principal, superintendent and parent will occur.
- Will the buses be sanitized after each use? Yes they will be.
- Are they allowed to bring their own masks? Yes as long as they are appropriate.
- Will kids be with the same students all day?
 As much as it's possible, yes.
- What happens on the virtual days if the child has internet issues? Will they be allowed to watch a recorded lesson? Yes they will.
- When they are online, can the student interact with the class and ask questions?
 Yes they can.
- If there are social emotional concerns that have started since COVID should the parents tell the school in advance. Yes, please make us aware of any concerns.
- Do the "My School Bucks" accounts transfer from building to building with the student?

Yes – the accounts automatically follow the student.

 Will tech support be readily available for difficulty with the chrome books?

Yes it will. Not only will we be sending home "tech tidbits" from time to time, we will be available for you to call with any tech questions.

- On the survey, what % of parents said they were keeping their children home for only virtual learning?
 - At this time 81% of our students are returning to campus and 19% will be fully virtual.
- What is your plan if a child and/or teacher is noncompliant with the mask policy?
 - Students will be held to the "Code of Conduct" which addresses rules and regulations concerning wearing of a mask.
- If you signed up for hybrid and situations have changed can you switch to full virtual now?
 Yes you can.

- What if you leave for work before your child gets up (a high school student)? How do you do the temp check etc. We would ask the HS student to record his/her own.
- How will you distinguish the difference between COVID symptoms and just an asthma attack where they wouldn't need to be sent home or put in isolation and just need their inhaler?
 - We would have a discussion with you regarding your child's medical history and look at each case individually.
- COVID tests take over a week to come back—will the child/ adult be required to remain out of school until that time?
 Yes they will, and would learn virtually until the results come back


All schools will be practicing an evacuation drill. Students will be dismissed 15 minutes early that day!
