The ability to think or rationalize is indispensable to a full and worthy life today. If these powers are not well developed in the individual, in our modern society, he becomes a victim to every con artist that exists. There are pitfalls of "bad thinking" that await students personally every day. The teenage market is being exploited as it never has been before—why is this? I think what a top editor of a magazine for girls recently said to a convention of manufacturers gives us a pretty good idea—

"Our girl, the teenager, has money—\$5,000,000,000—all her own a year. And her money is wonderful money—free and jingly. She doesn't put it in a piggy bank or gilt-edged securities—she is acquisitive, like Midas, she's always making wishes—wishes like; I need—I must have—I can't do without—I want, and like Midas, whatever she reaches for, turns to gold. What she hears about, reads about, learns about, she yearns about. Her yearnings increased your earnings."

I like to see students work for and get what they want and I like to see boys and girls well dressed, but consider this picture—does it not portray a mindless consumer, a victim of fads and fancies, a target who is defenseless to the wiles of a sophisticated advertising world?

Before you take that long walk down Carnaby Street this Fall, to do your shopping, get in the know—be "tough," be a thinking animal!

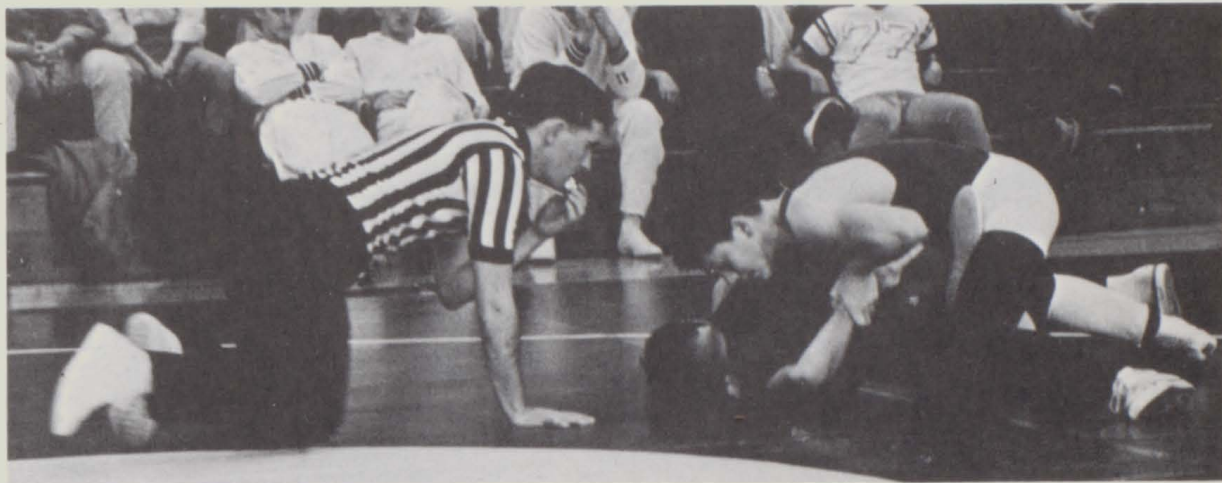

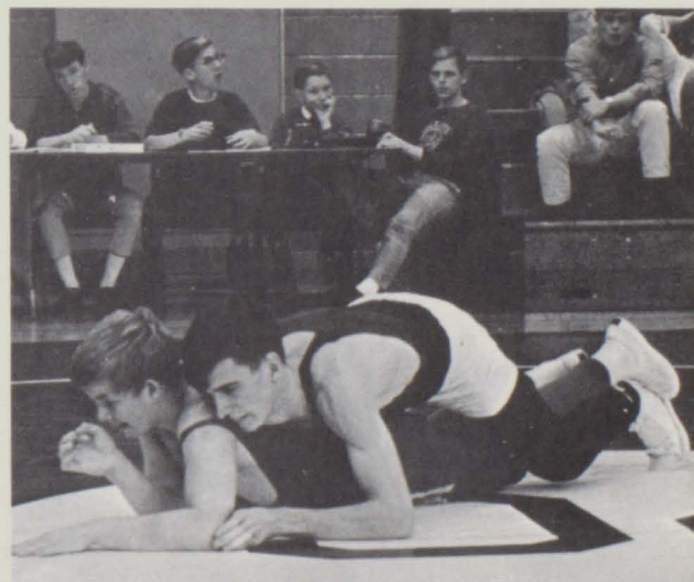

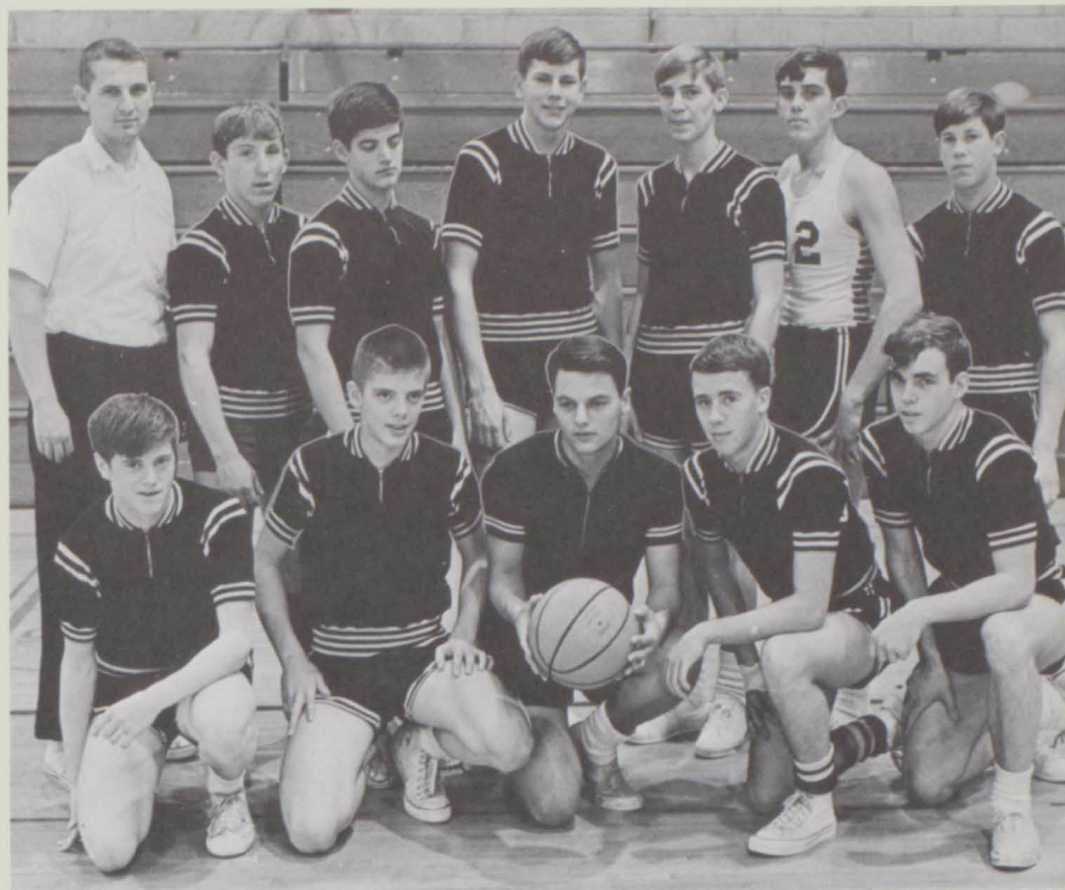

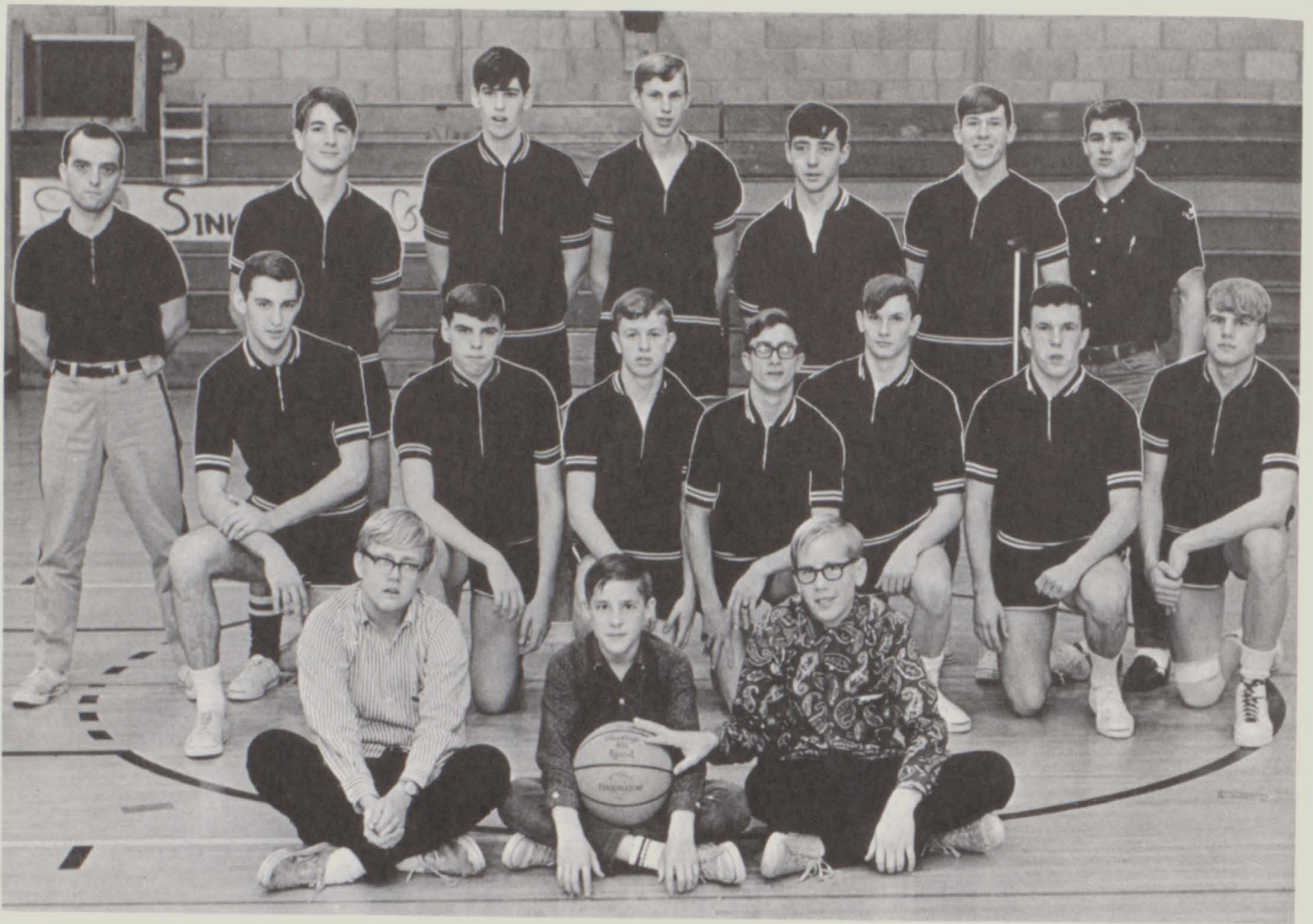

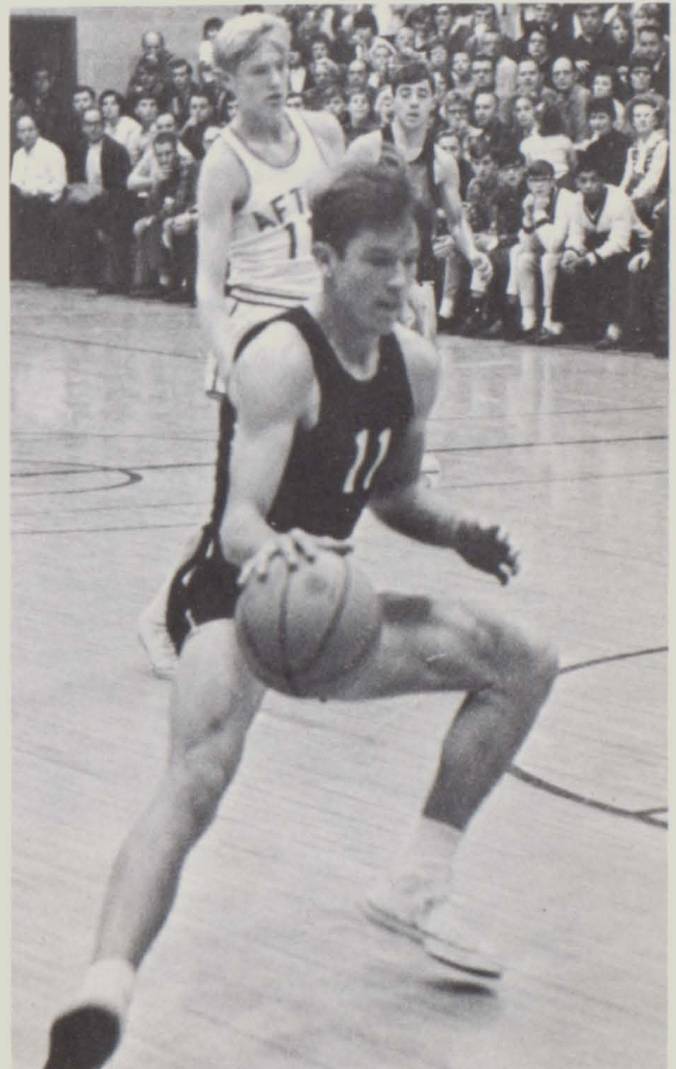

U. N. Model General Assembly

Last March a group of six students and two advisors comprised the delegation representing the country of Austria and, secondarily, the Bainbridge-Guilford Central School, at the Model U. N. 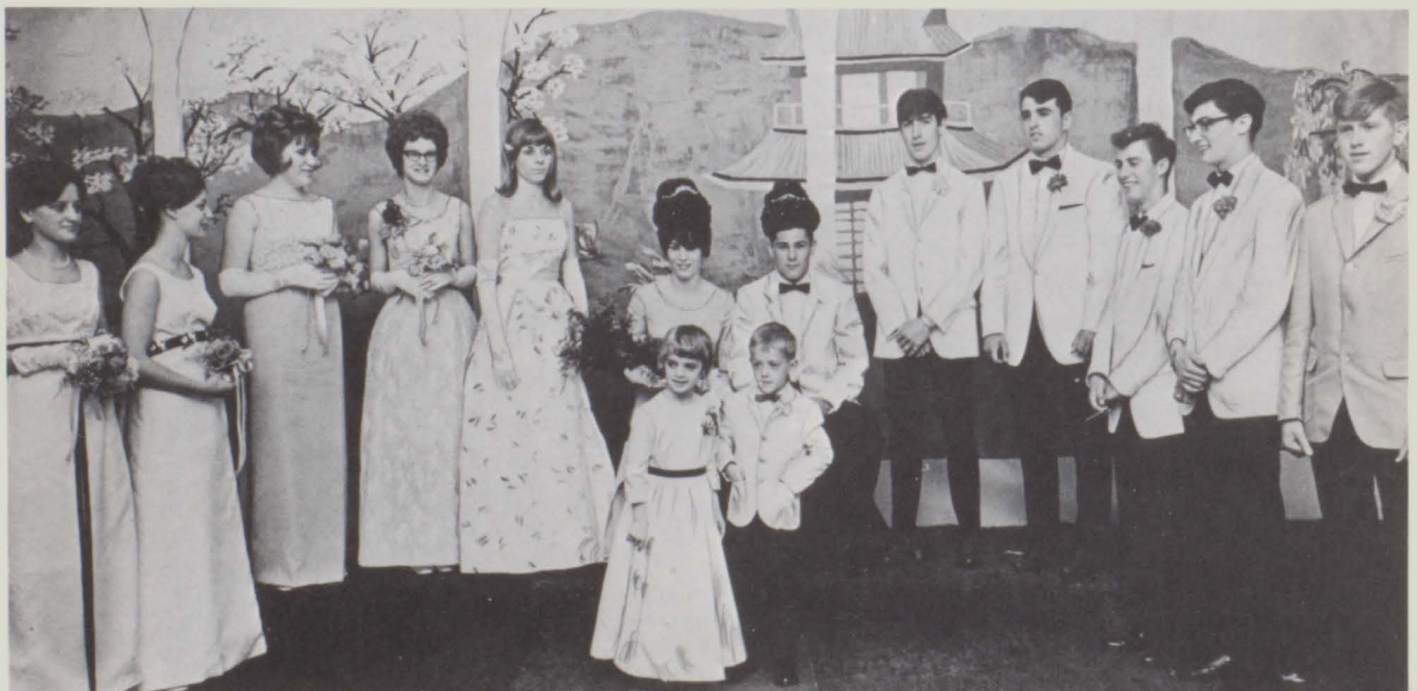
