#### Our New Student Government

The 1971-1972 school year has seen the initiation of a new school government at B-G. Being the first year, it was of utmost importance that the government functions smoothly and efficiently. In that manner the government will have a sturdy foundation for future years.

The new government is made up of four committees. They are the Student Faculty-Administration Council, the Student Court, the Student Services Committee and the Cultural Committee.

The Student-Faculty-Administrative Council (SFA) is made up of five students, five faculty members, and two administrators. The SFA is an advisory board that oversees the operations of the other groups.

The Student Court is a judical body made up of eleven students which functions much as the courts of our nation do, to deal with student misbehavoir.

"Then it has odne you no good at all!"


