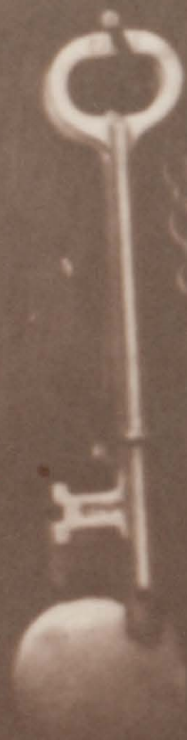

Expand your horizons, and face your future with pride.*

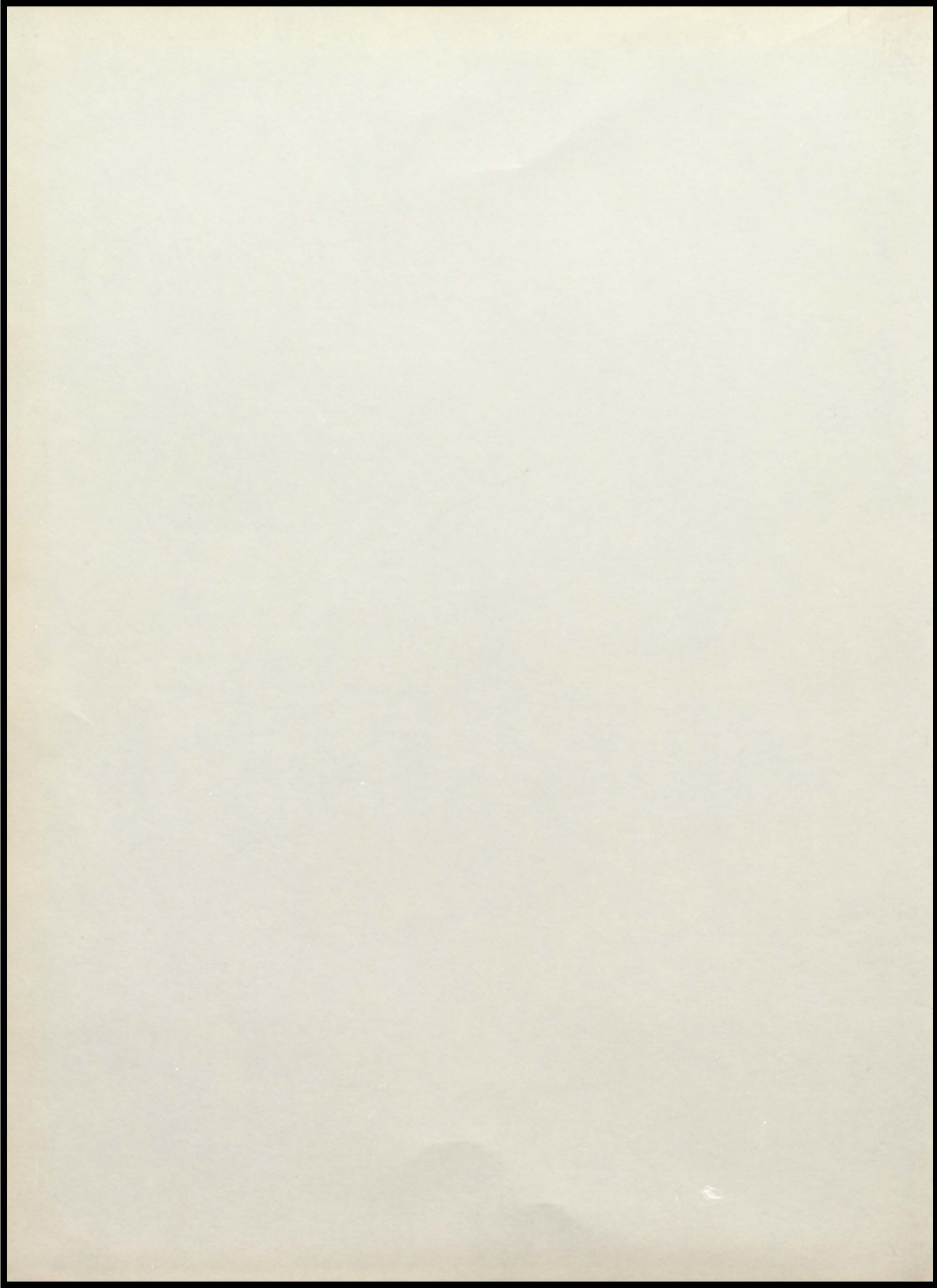
*In life how far you go, and how high you rise

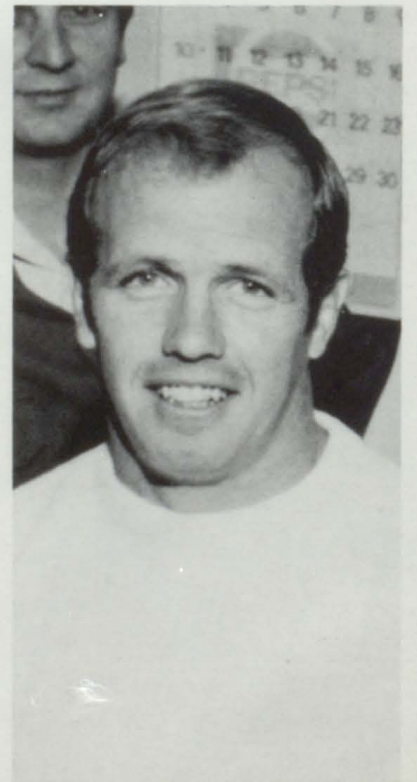
## DEDICATION

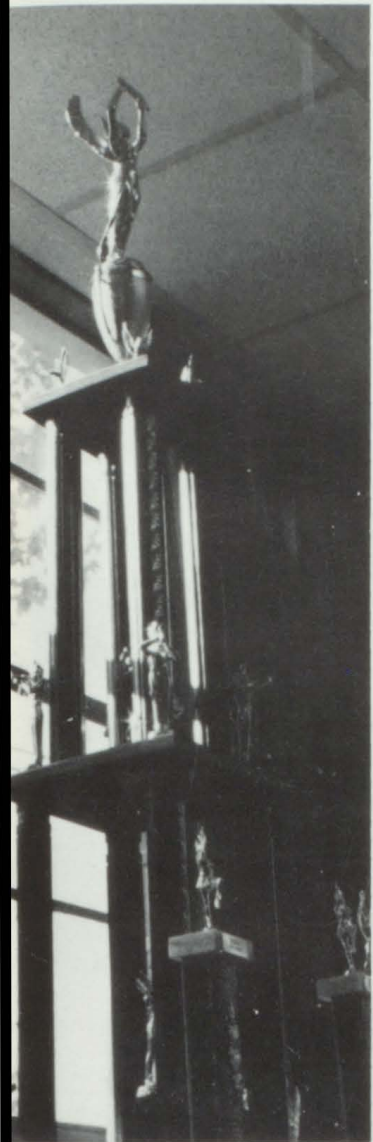


# BEST IN THE BUSINESS" — BY TOM HENGEVELD

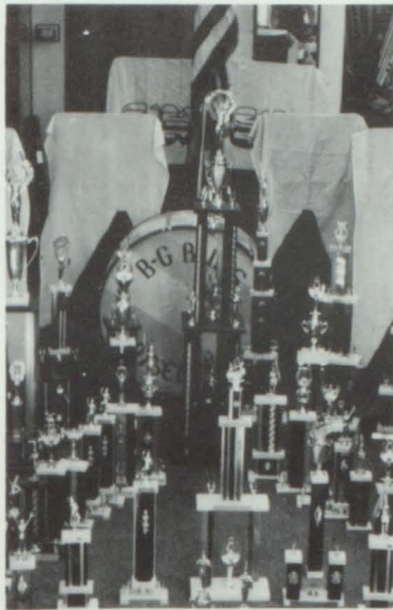

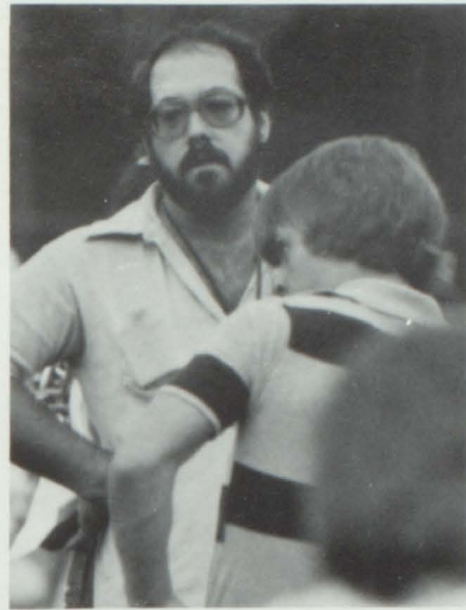

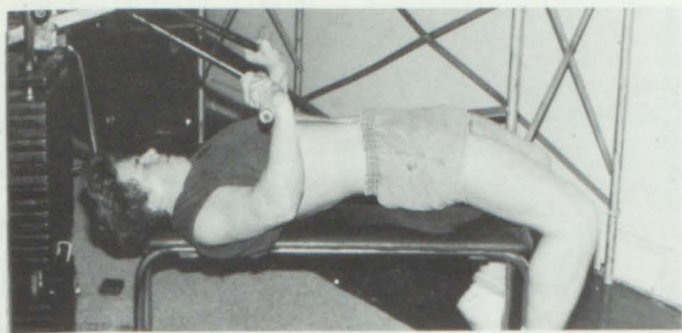

## MR. BILLY'S SIDELINE SPASMS BY TAD PALMER

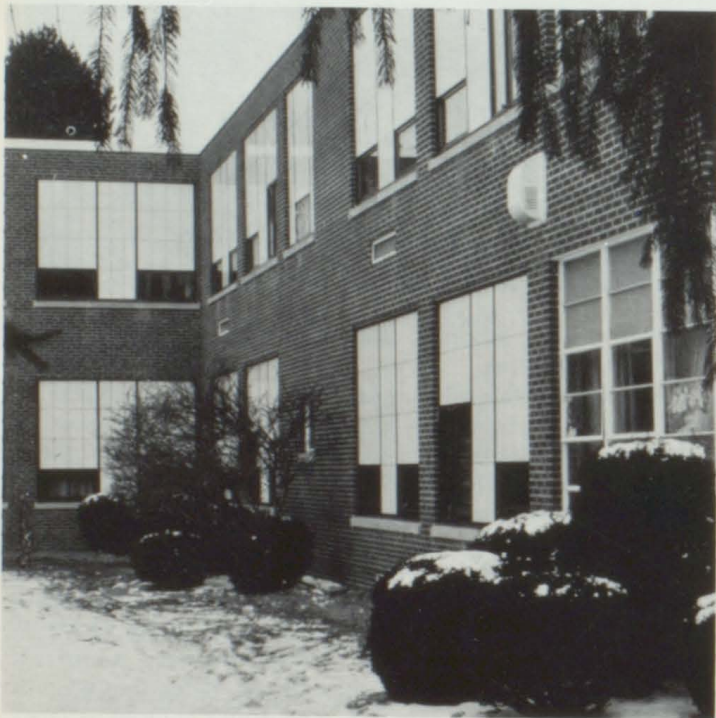

## THE NEW LOOK BY DENNIS CLEARY



As an integral part of the Energy Conservation Package approved by district voters, new energy conserving windows are being installed in all three district buildings by the J.W. Hawk Company at an approximate cost of \$270,000. The work has been scheduled around school sessions and activities, to avoid any inconveniences for the students, faculty, and administration. The new windows consist of two translucent fiberglass panels which are bonded to a grid core of interlocking

aluminum I beams. Fiberglass insulation is blown in between the two panels for additional insulating qualities. The glass portion of the windows is thermopane glass. The projected savings in heating expenses of the \$400,000 Energy Conservation Package, including both the windows and the new suspended ceilings at the high school, is approximately \$25,000 annually.
