The Juniors transformed the gym into a spectacular version of New York City. "This Could Be The Night" proved to be a night we'll always remember.

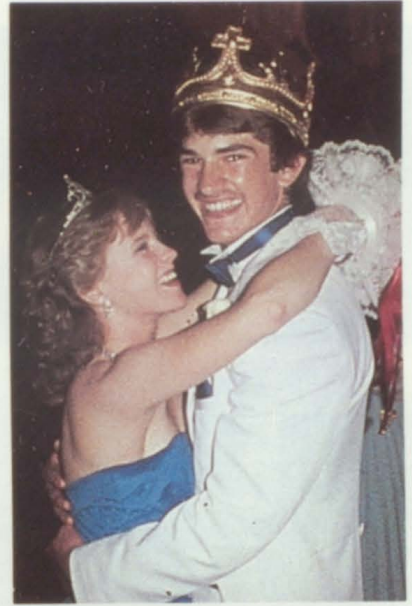

Floyd Prouty Retires After 27 Years of Service

Mr. Floyd L. Prouty will officially retire from his position as Assistant Superintendent for instruction as of July 1, 1987.

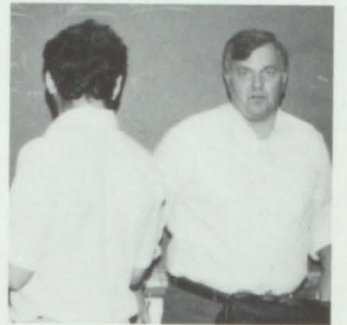
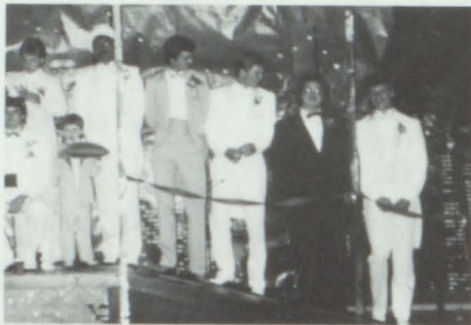
Floyd was born near Adams, New York, a small town near Watertown. While in high school he was active in sports — playing 4 years of baseball and basketball and two years of football. In college Floyd was active, playing J.V. basketball for two years, working on the college newspaper — serving as Editor in Chief his senior year, and he was very involved in college in college drama productions, both on and off stage. He received a B.S. in elementary education in 1953.

In the fall of 1960 Mr. Prouty became the elementary school principal in Bainbridge. We asked Mr. Prouty what his philosophy of education has been over the years. He said, "The educational process is continuously in a state of flux. Therefore we must change and improve

the system if we are to match the needs of a changing society and need the warnings of research on learning. I believe that some change is both healthy and necessary in today's world."

By the time Mr. Prouty had become elementary principal here, he had been working on a master's degree in administration at Cortland. In 1983 Floyd was promoted to the position of Assistant Superintendent for instruction in the district. In this capacity he was responsible for teacher evaluation, Middle States evaluation procedure, summer curriculum development and in-service training, teaching strategies, a liaison between elementary and secondary facilities, and an overseer, in many various committees and responsibilities.

What are his thoughts about working here so long? He said, "I feel fortunate that I have worked here in Bainbridge. Bainbridge people are very accepting, accommodating, supportive and cooperative. I was able to try things and had the liberty to be creative. To be "locked in" would have made me unhappy. Every year in education is different, that's the way it is and really education has no ruts."
