Students evacuated; no injuri

BAINBRIDGE - Officials evacuated about 500 Bainbridge-Guilford students and sealed off the high school Thursday after a boiler explosion because they feared it had spread asbestos through the air.

The boiler at the Bainbridge-Guilford Central High School exploded at about 9:30 a.m., setting off the automatic fire alarm and sending the teachers and students outside, most without coats. There were no injuries and the explosion's cause was unknown Thursday, said Bainbridge Fire Chief John Hyzer.

Another school concern is that the pipes within the heatless building may freeze as the temperature drops. There is a backup boiler, but the custodians cannot turn it on until people are allowed back into the school, said Carroll. The staff has pipes will freeze.

"We heard a loud noise downstairs and we all thought something heavy fell down," said student Kristy Carlin. "Then the fire alarm went buses that took them to Greenlay off and we all rushed outside."
