Boiler explodes at B-G school

Students evacuated; no injuries

BAINBRIDGE — Officials evacuated about 500 Bainbridge-Guilford students and sealed off the high school Thursday after a boiler explosion because they feared it had spread asbestos through the air.

The boiler at the Bainbridge-Guilford Central High School exploded at about 9:30 a.m., setting off the automatic fire alarm and sending the teachers and students outside, most without coats. There were no injuries and the explosion's cause was unknown Thursday, said Bainbridge Fire Chief John Hyzer.

Another school concern is that the pipes within the heatless building may freeze as the temperature drops. There is a backup boiler, but the custodians cannot turn it on until people are allowed back into the school, said Carroll. The staff has estimated the building will stay warm enough for about 24 hours before the pipes will freeze.

"We heard a loud noise downstairs and we all thought something heavy fell down," said student Kristy Carlin. "Then the fire alarm went off and we all rushed outside."

Though people could not enter the building without masks, a firefighter, assistant superintendent of buildings and grounds, Tillapaugh, was in the room at the time, and was uninjured by the blast. Hyzer said Tillapaugh was doing caused the explosion.

The explosion occurred about 10 a.m. in the basement boiler room below the gymnasium, ripping a hole in an inch-thick access door to the boiler. Hyzer said. The cause of the explosion had not been determined, Hyzer said.

"I don't care if I never see a salami sandwich again," said teacher Judy Volkert, who said she was amazed how smoothly the effort went considering the amount of work to be done.

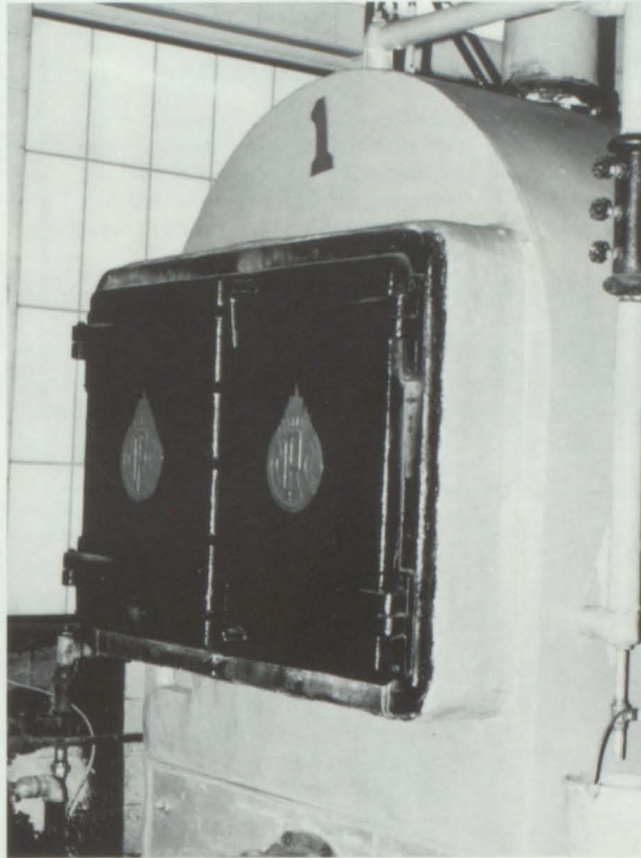
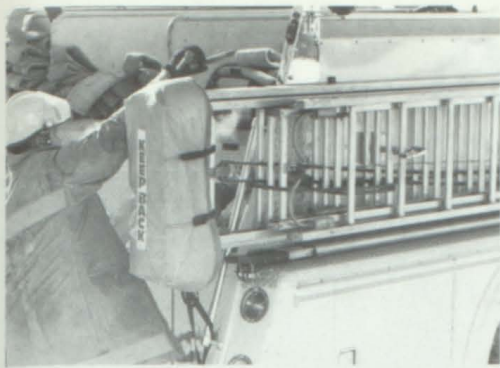
For students the emergency was an extra day from school work.

About 450 students and 40 teachers stayed outside for about five minutes then were taken to a shop building buses that took them to Greenlawn Elementary School.
