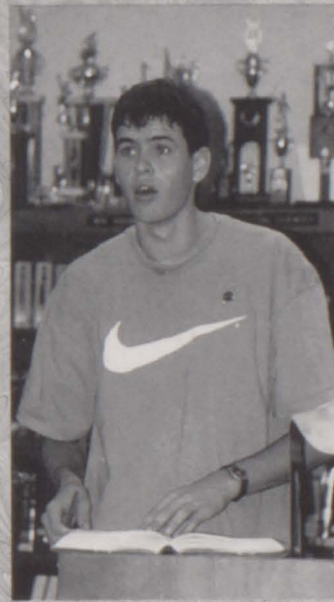

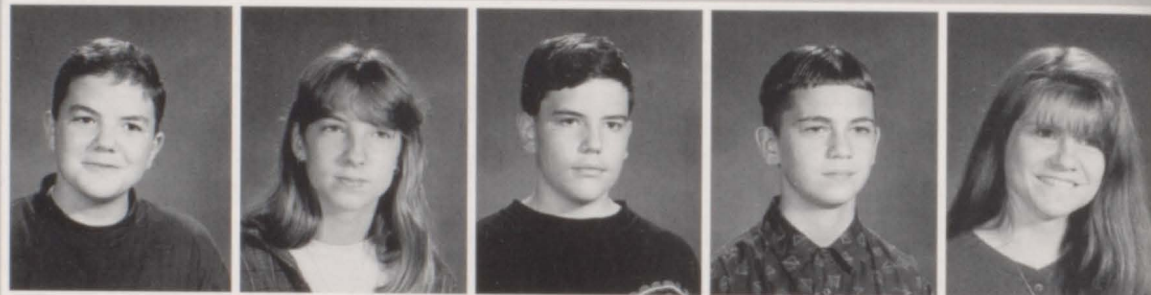
Class of 1999

Looking ahead to the future, Mr. Ashworth would like to be teaching in a foreign country. He said, “It would be exciting and something that I'd really like to do.” He has contributed in many ways to the students, faculty, and school in the years that he has taught here.

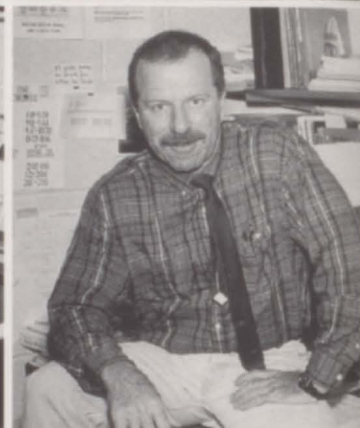

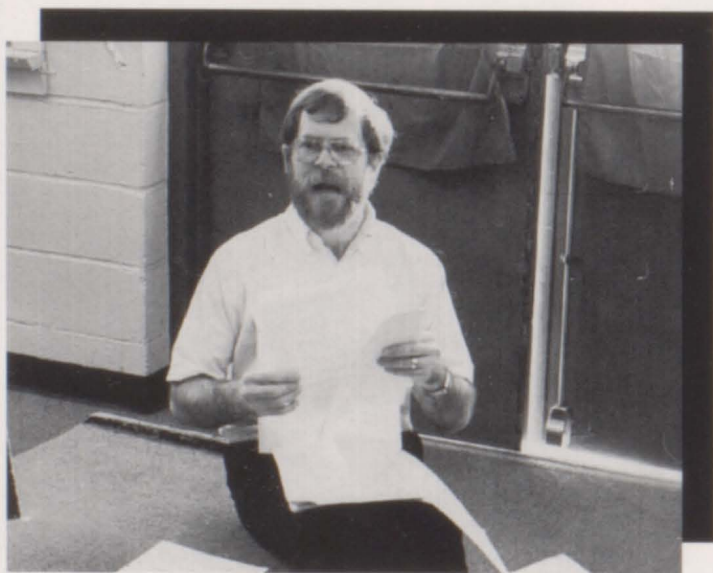
One Great Performance

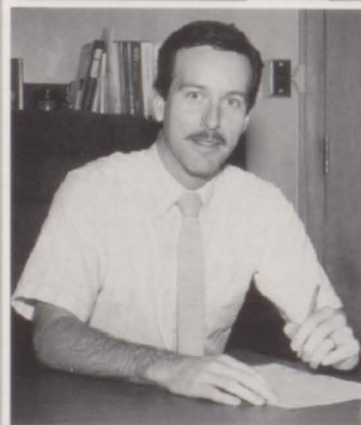
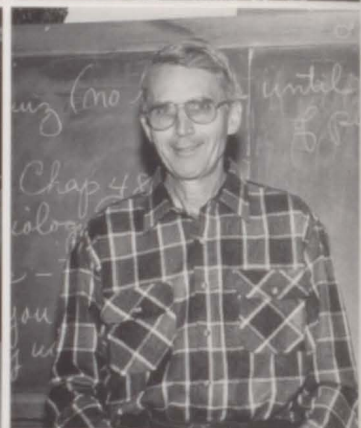
It is those small and far between successes that really please her. She feels that she has accomplished something when she helps a student and they truly appreciate it.

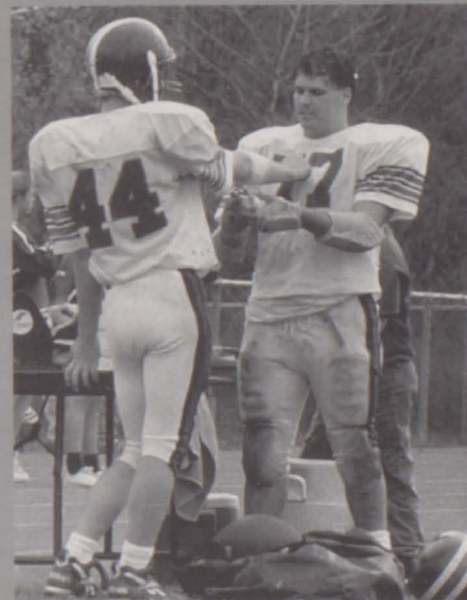

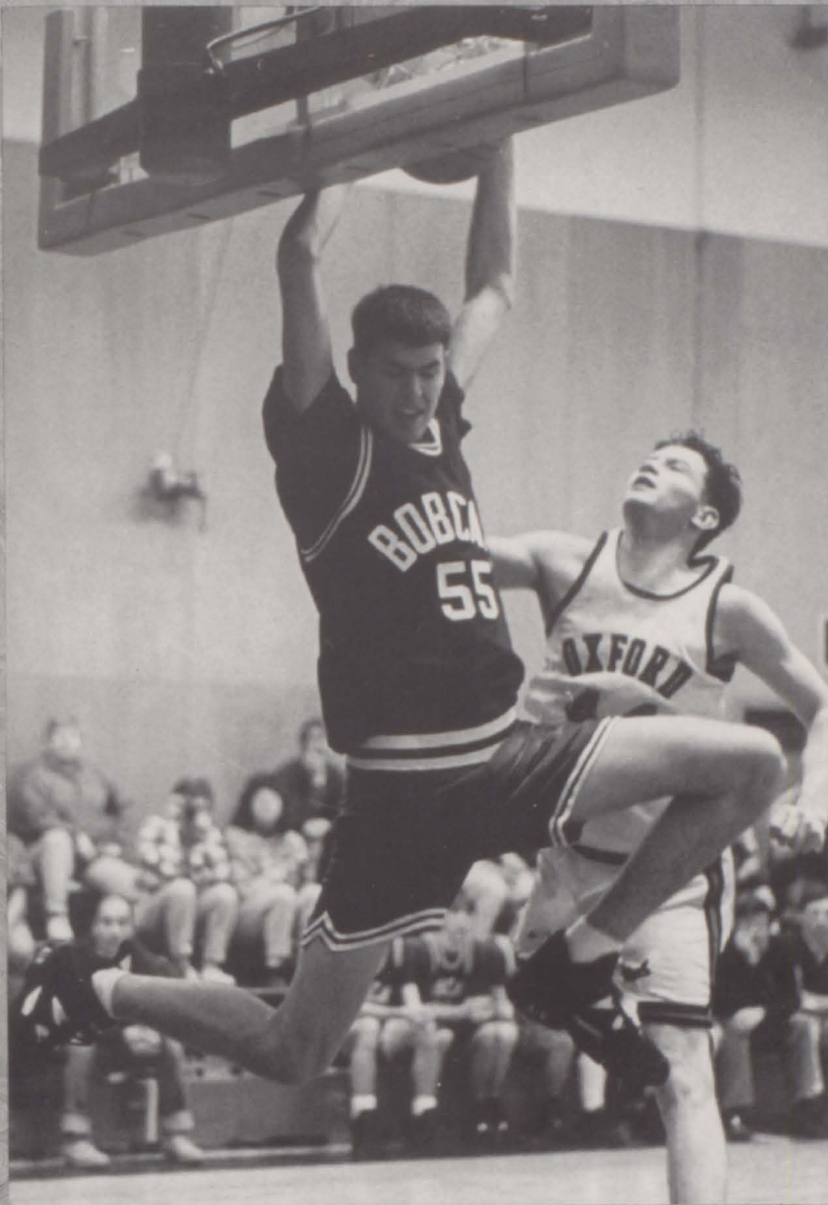

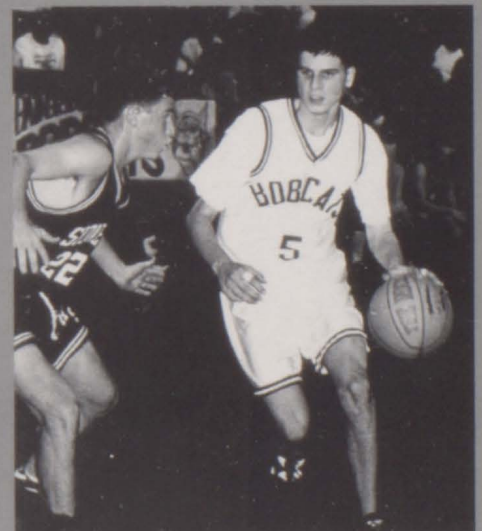

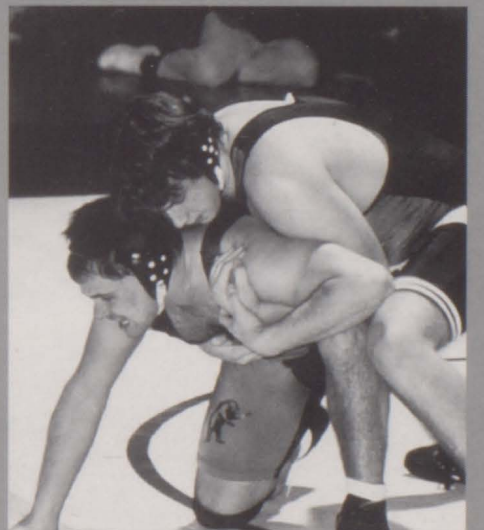

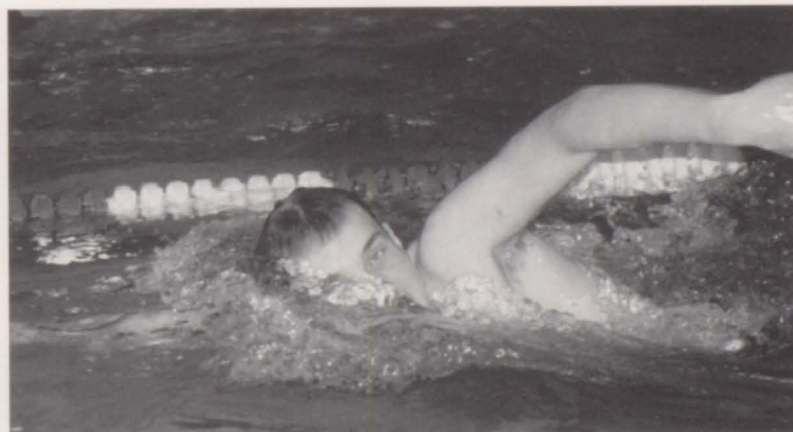

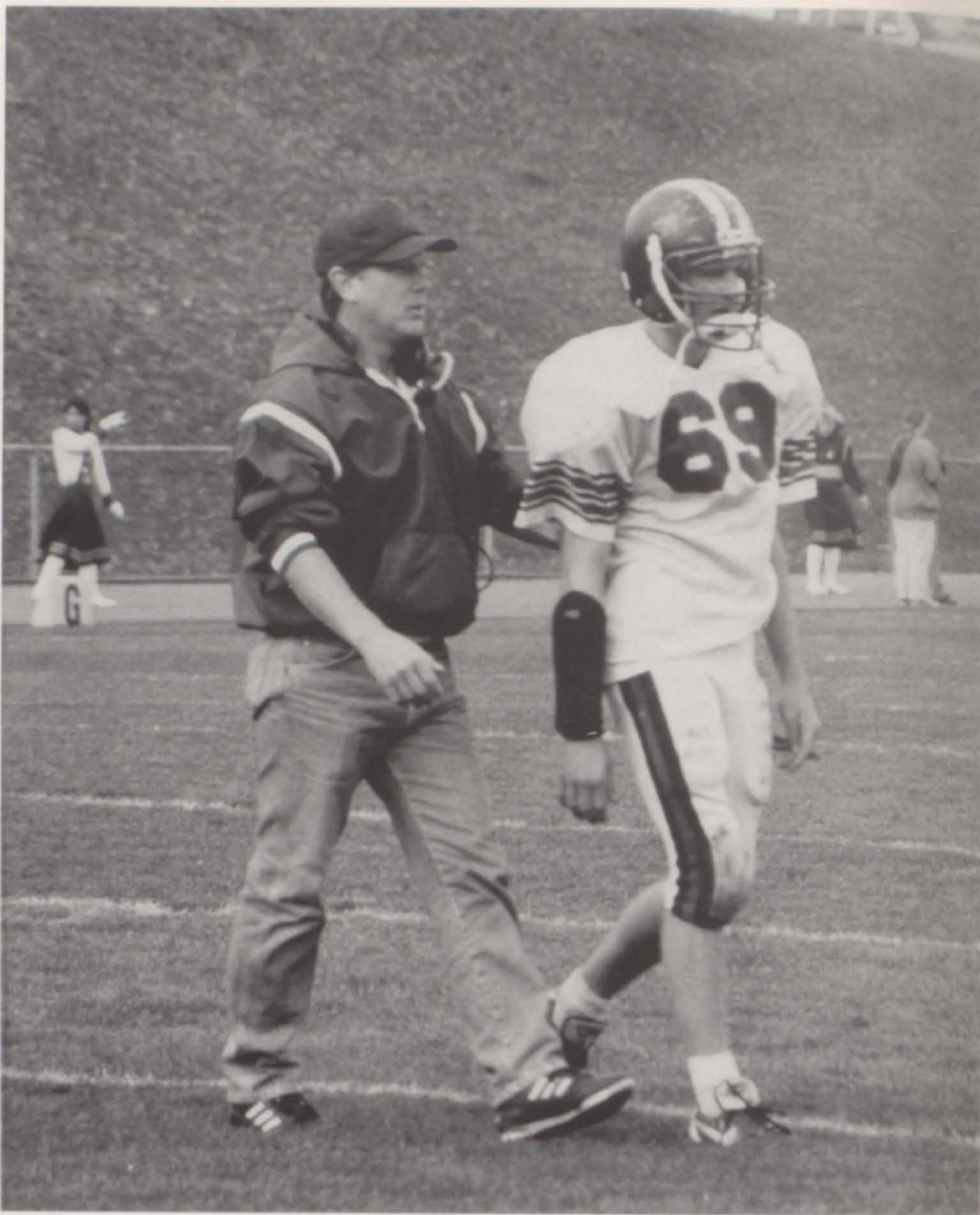

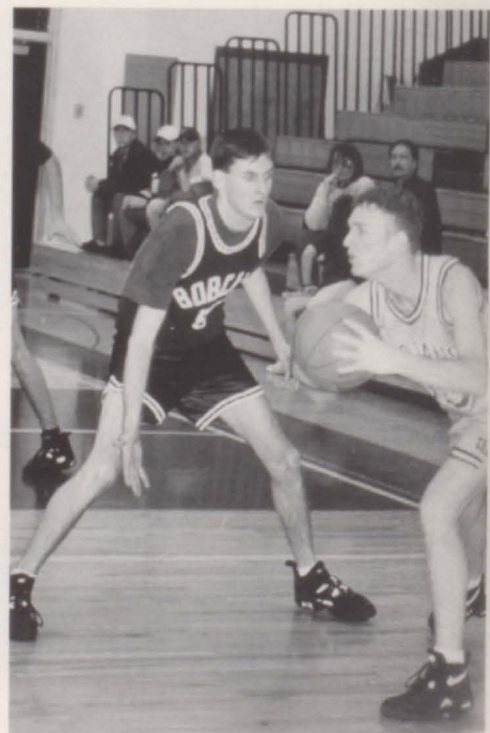

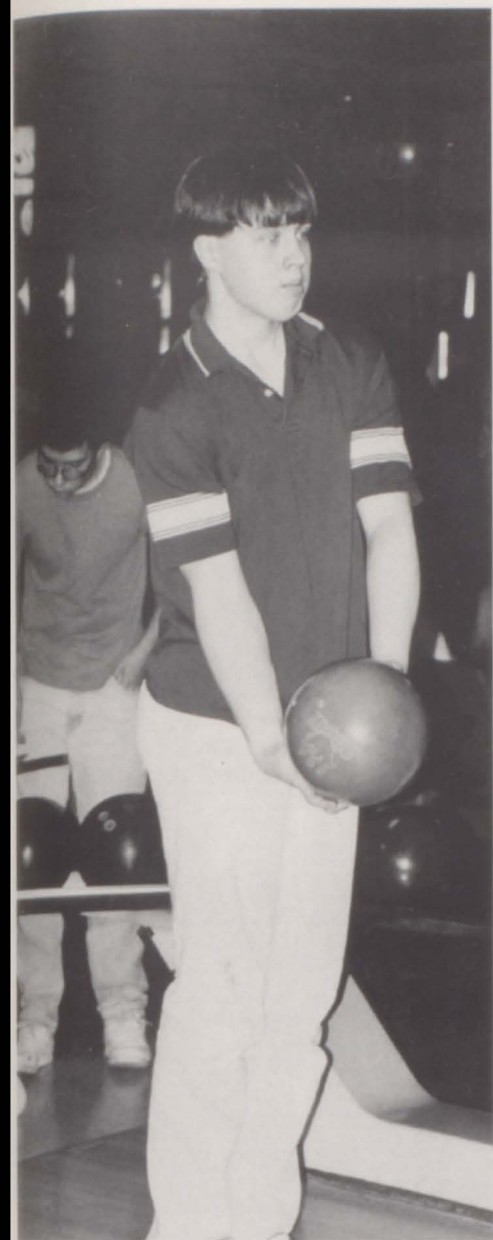

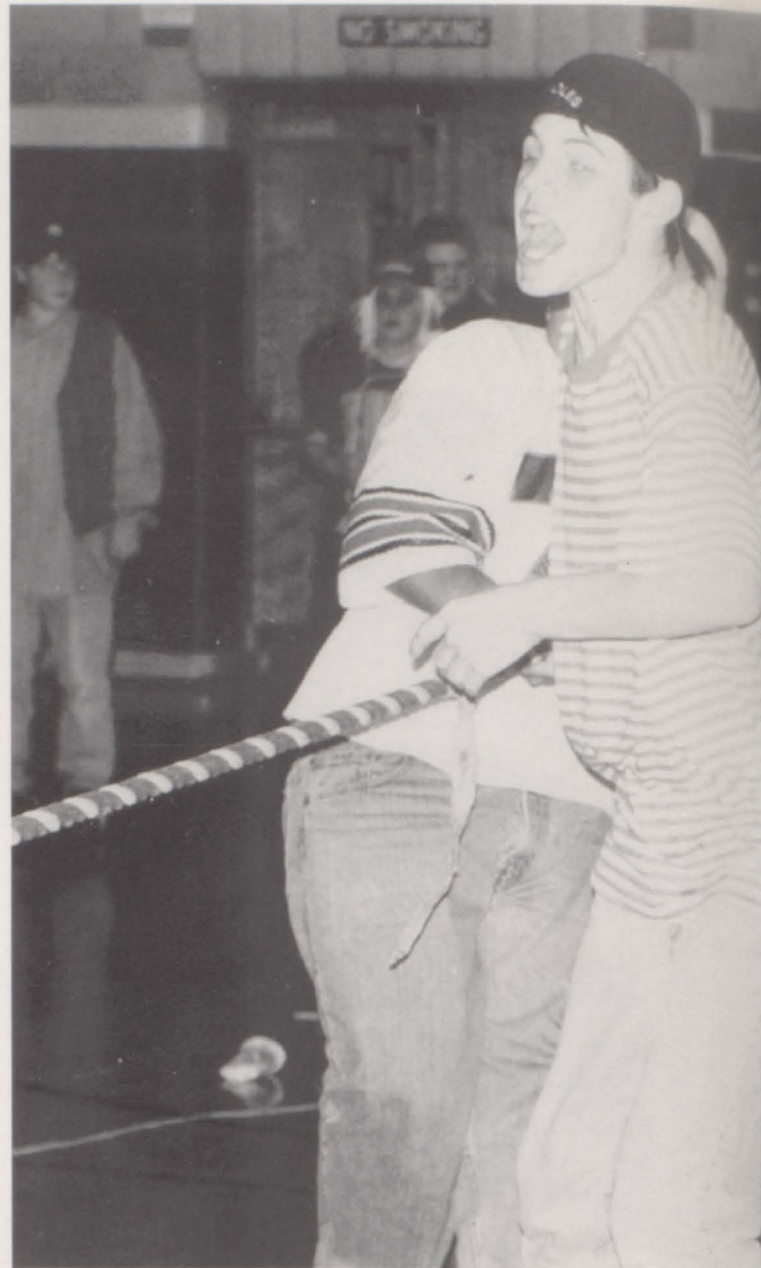

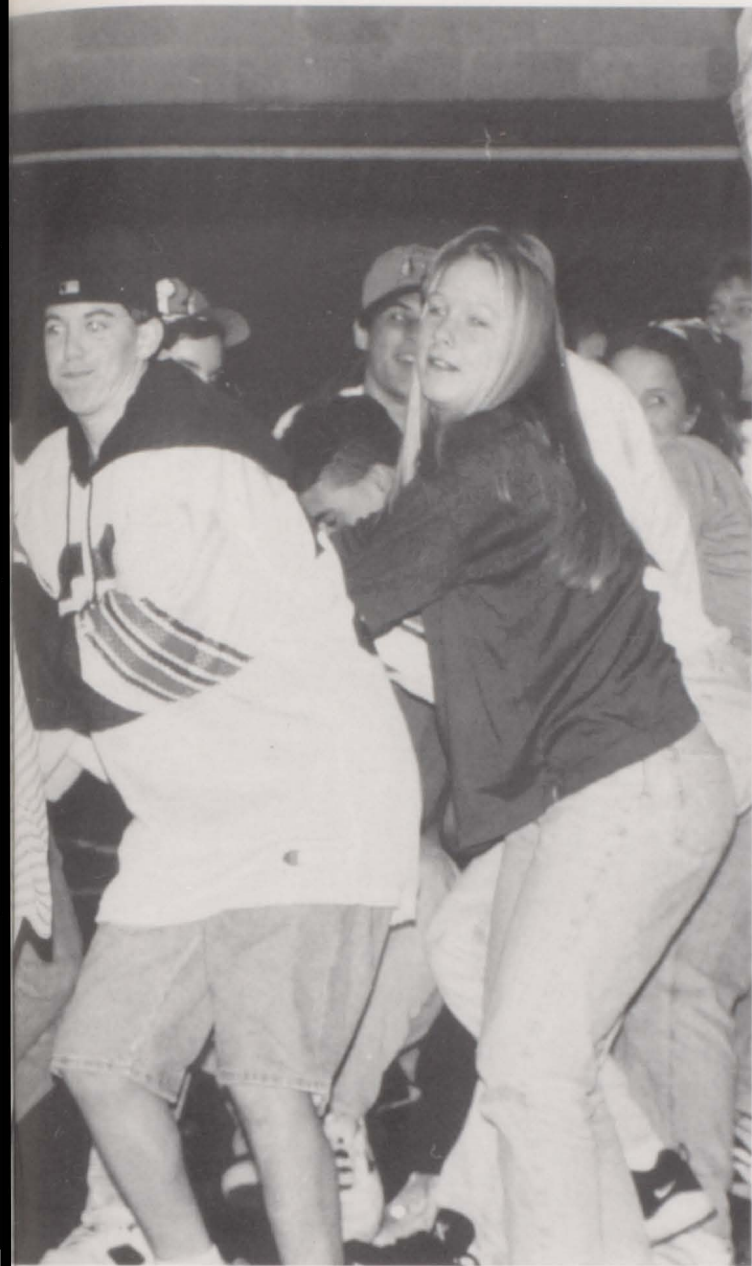

With unique endeavors

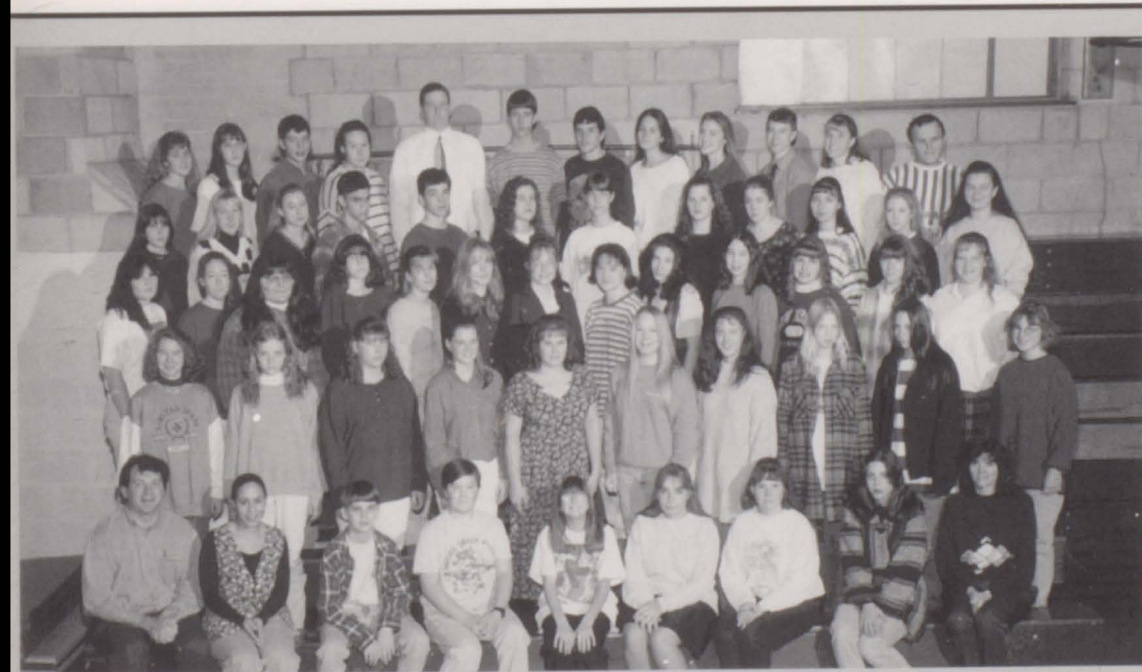
School clubs offer new ideas and experiences which are not found in everyday life. These clubs have the common goal of increasing students' thoughts and understanding of each other.

Focus is the "key" to beautiful music for Julie Schlafer, Leah Wade, and Bonnie Robertson.

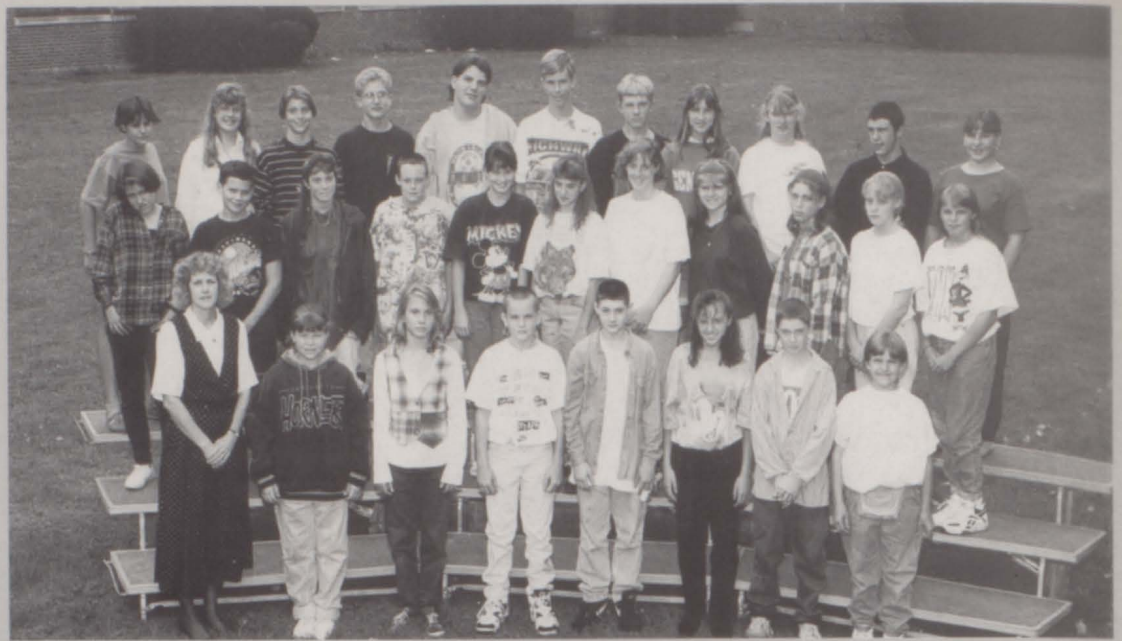
