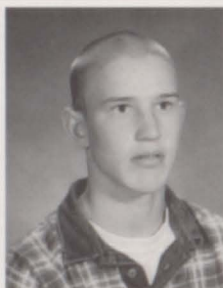
# CLASS OF 1998

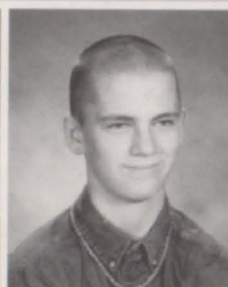
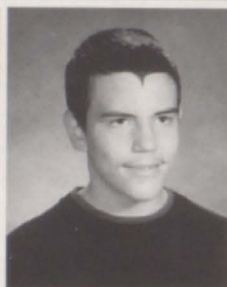
# CLASS OF 1999

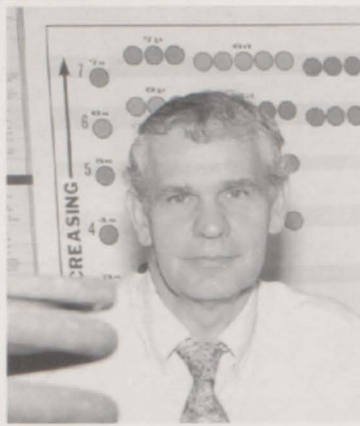
# STAFF

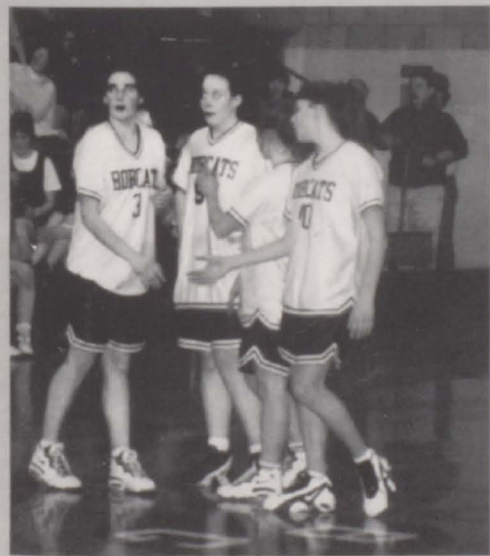

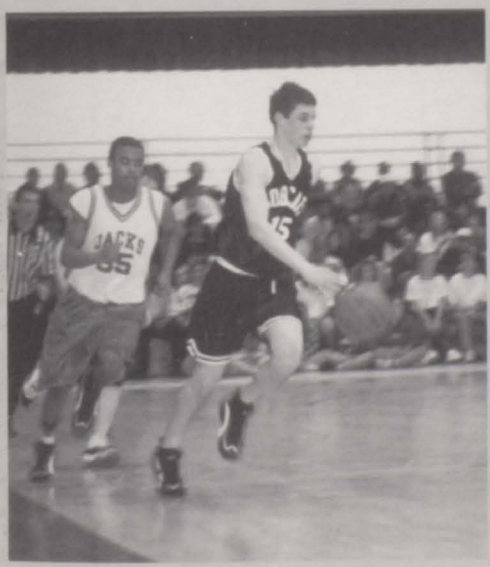

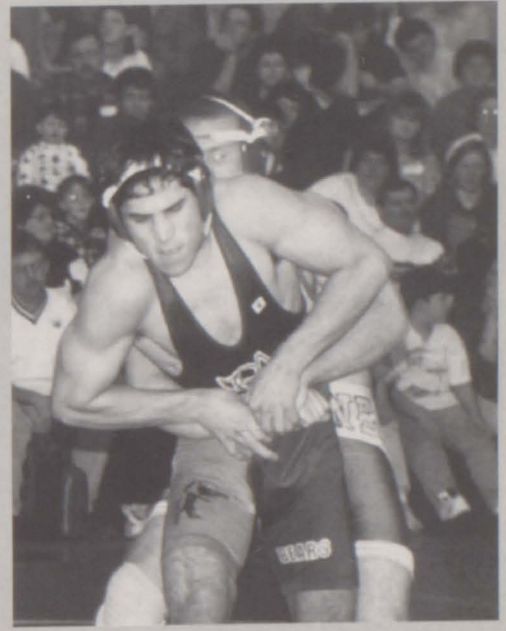

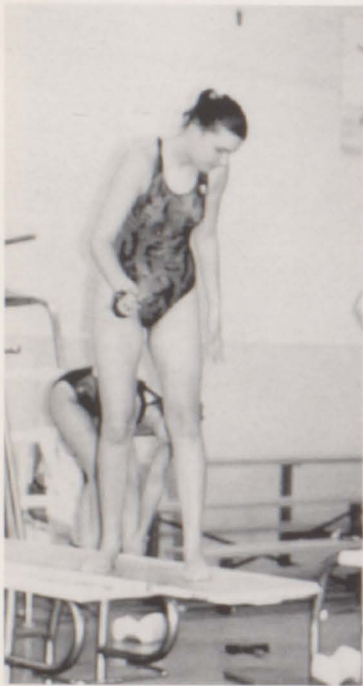

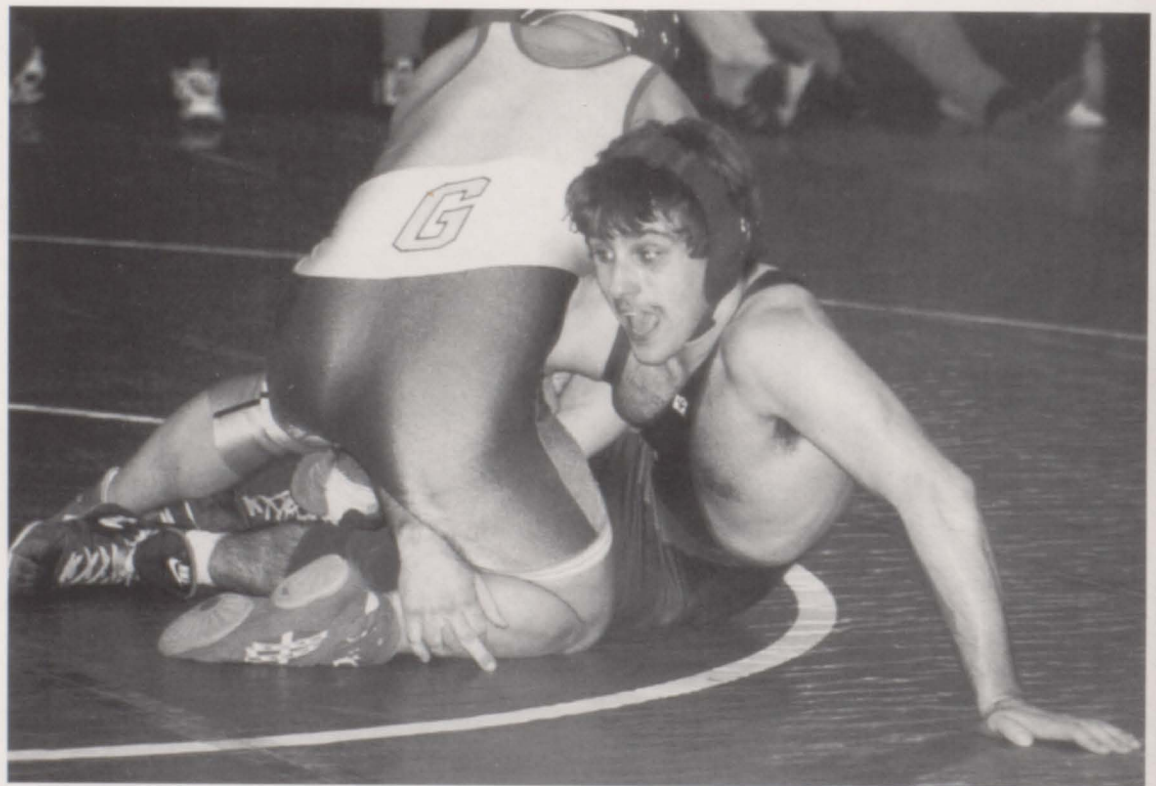

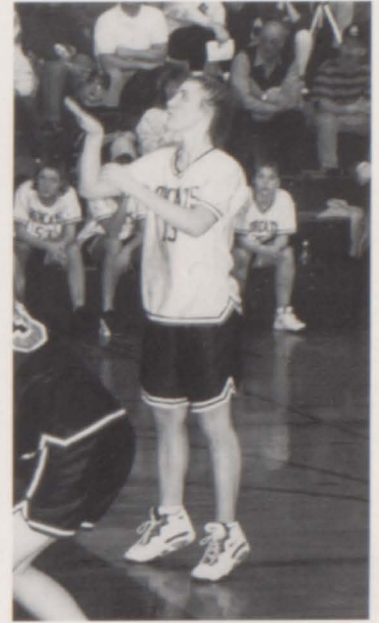

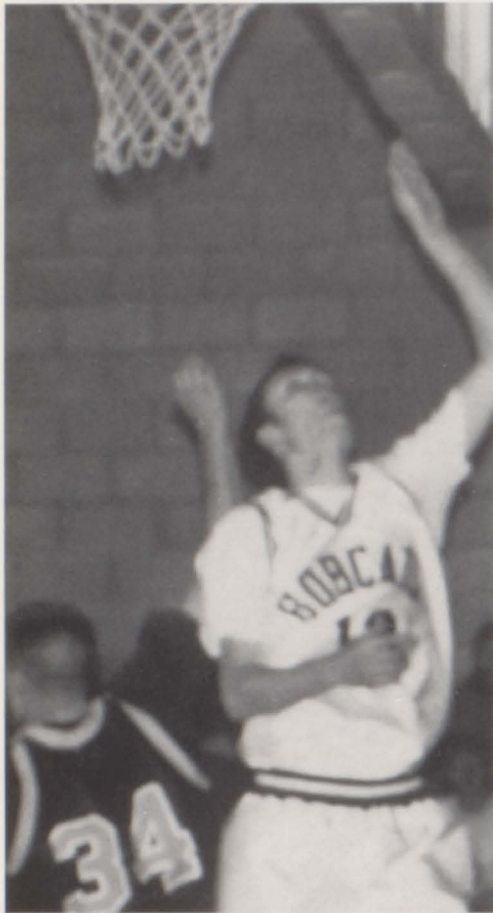

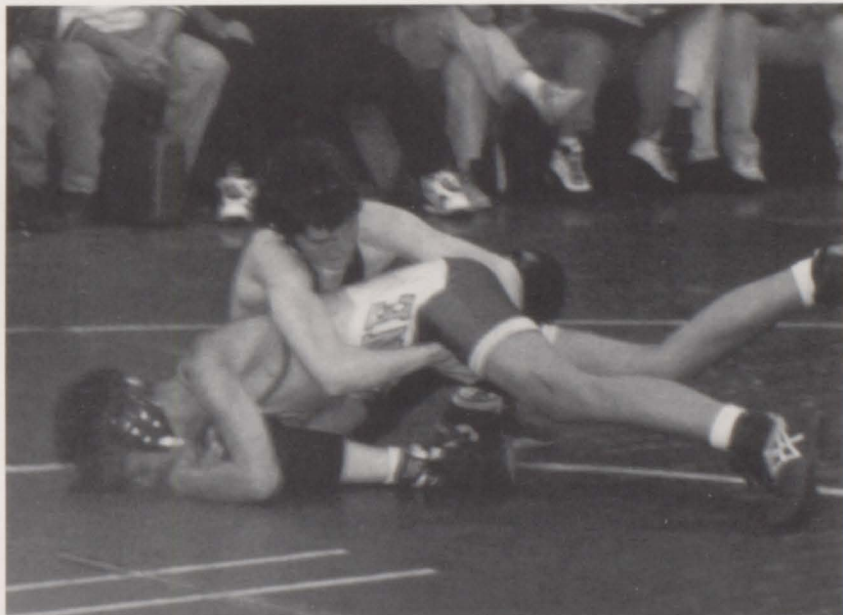

# ACTIVITIES

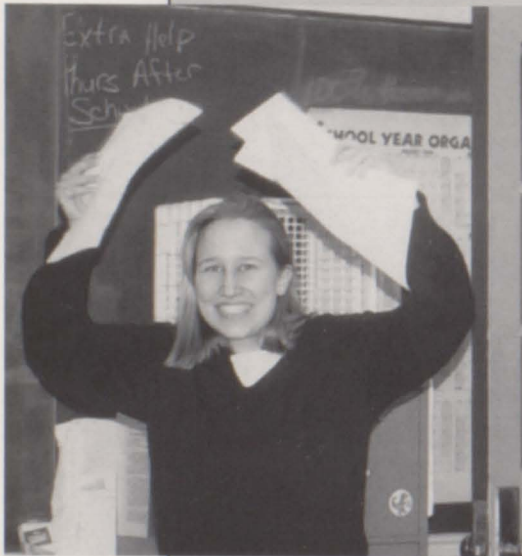

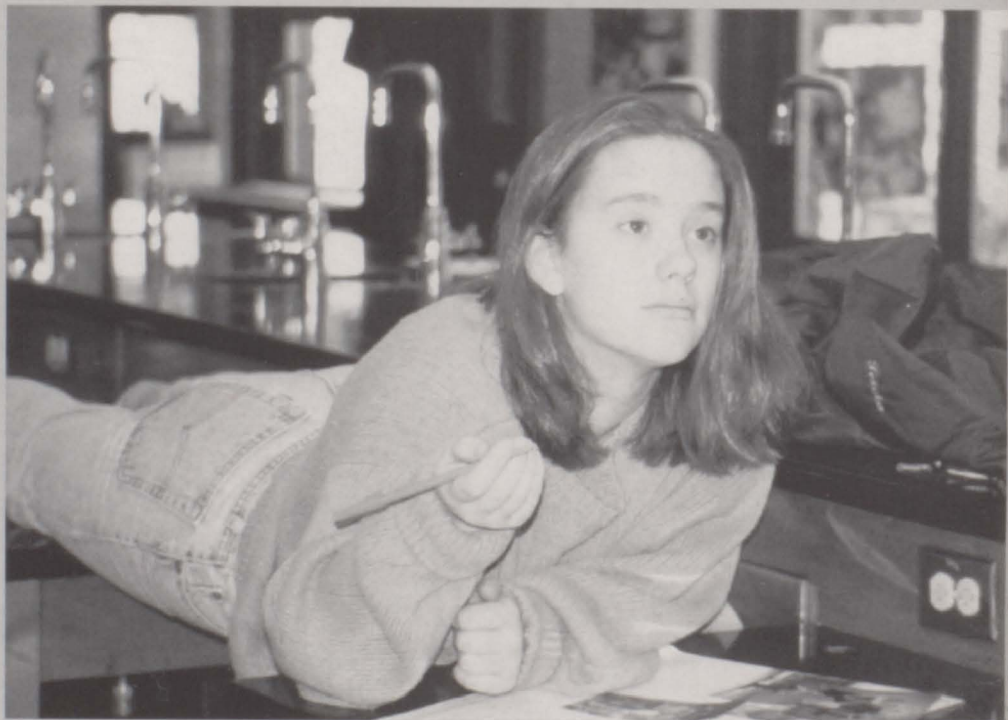

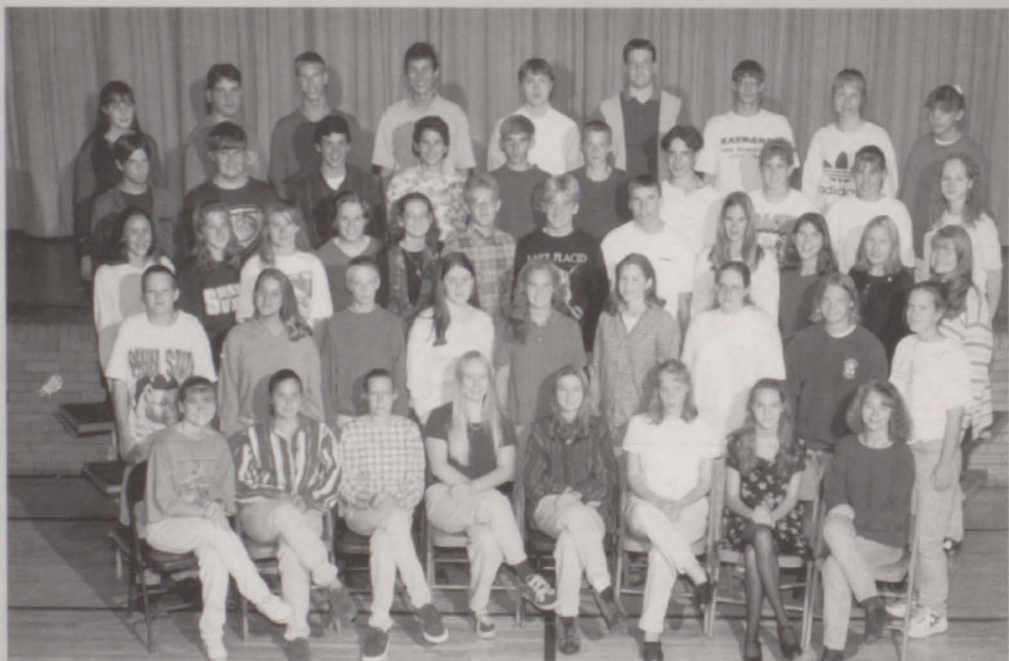
