



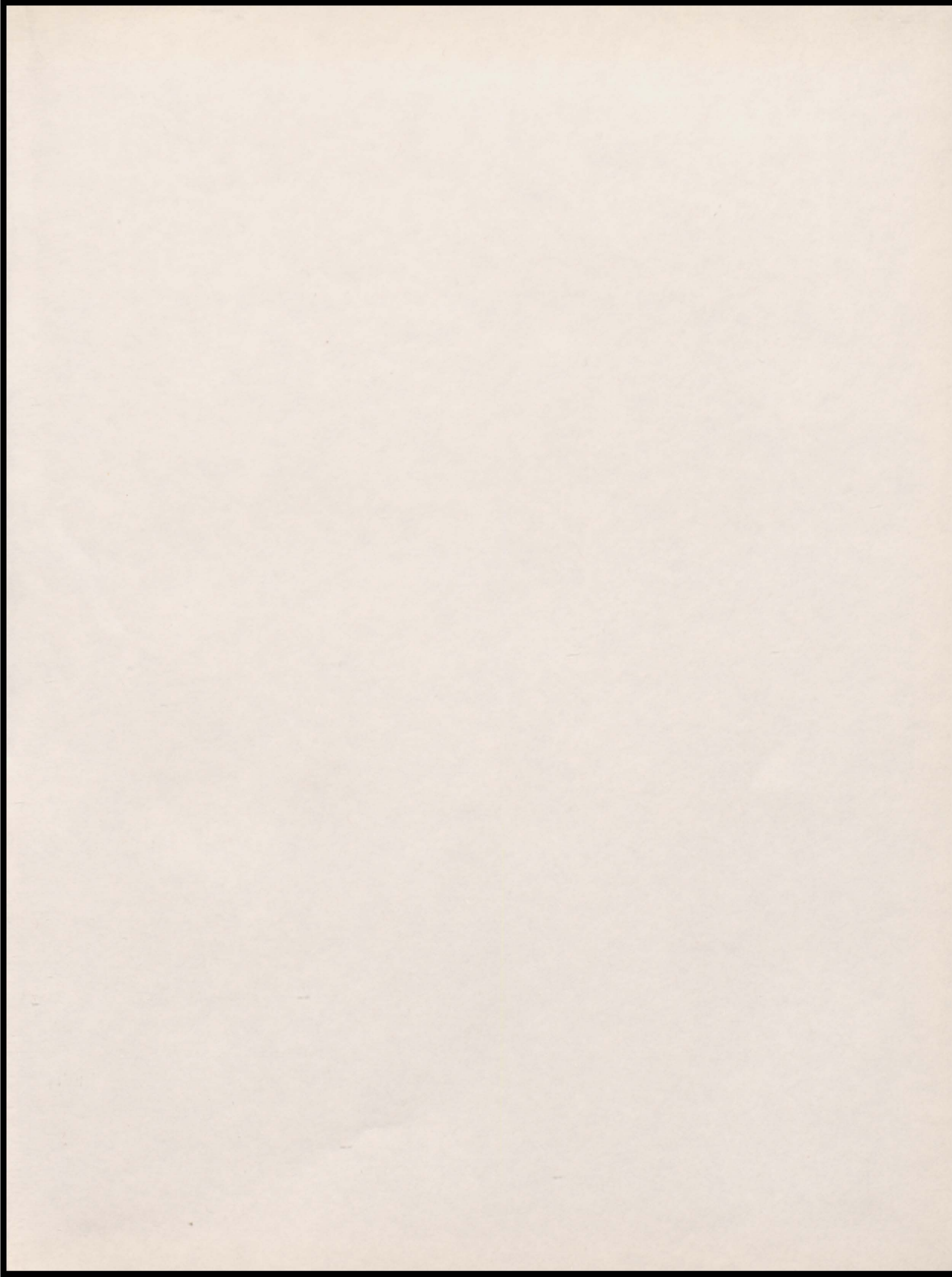

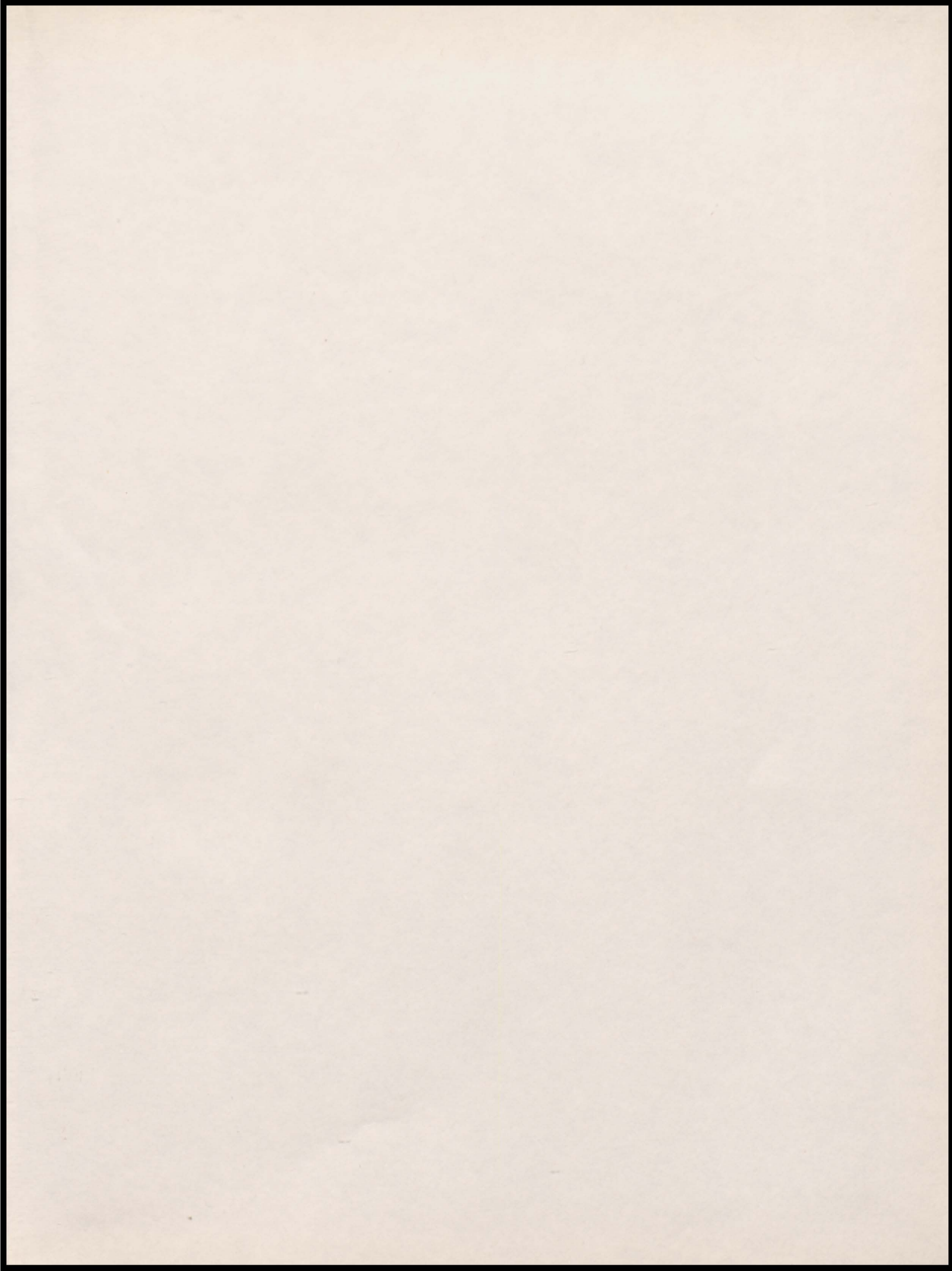

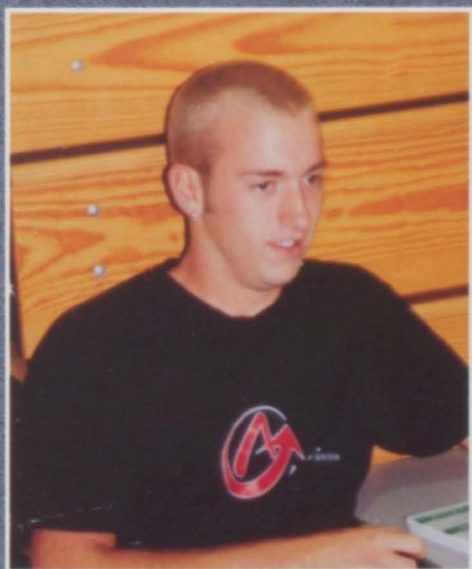


## What The Future Holds

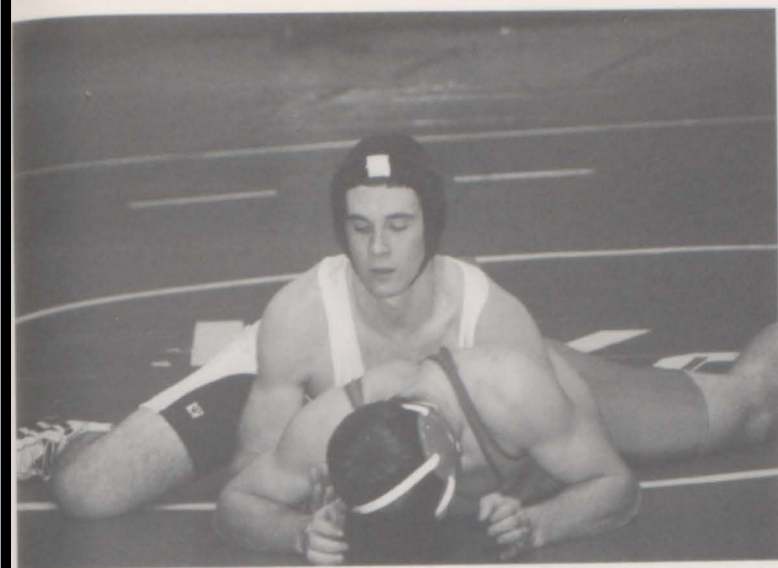


# Wrestling

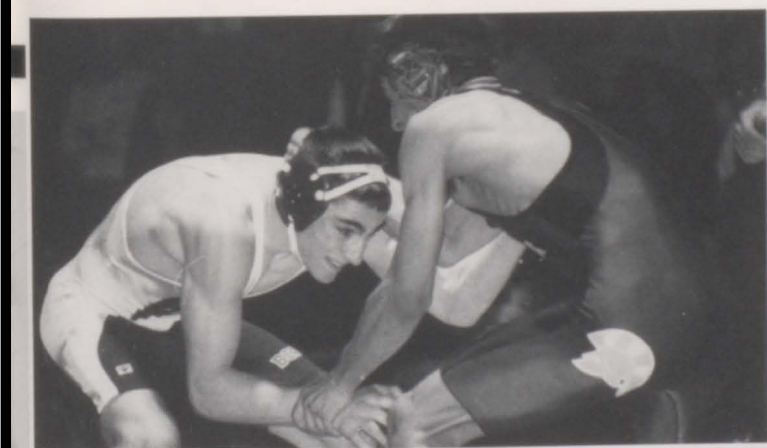

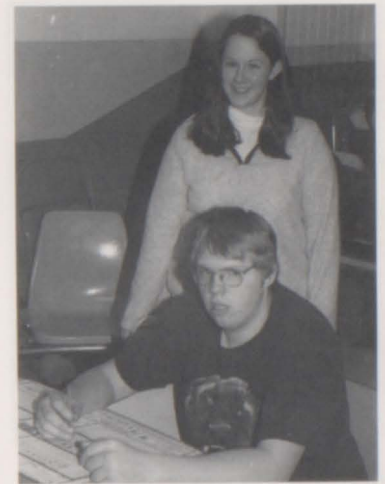

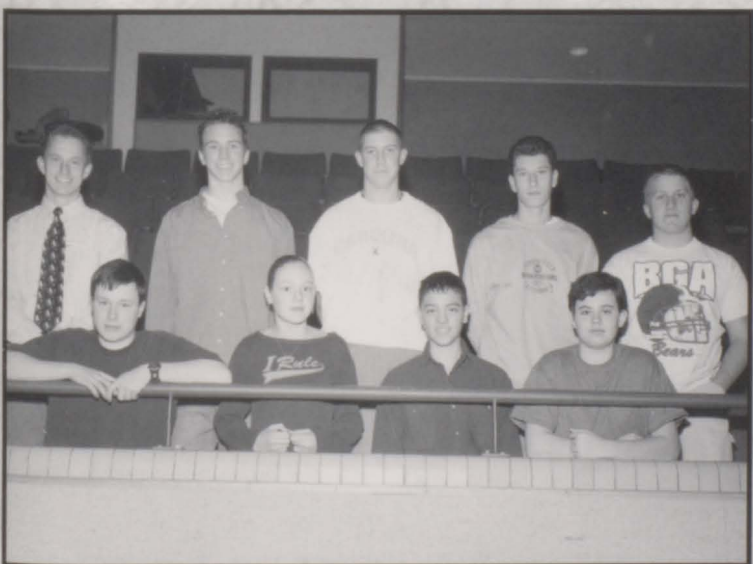

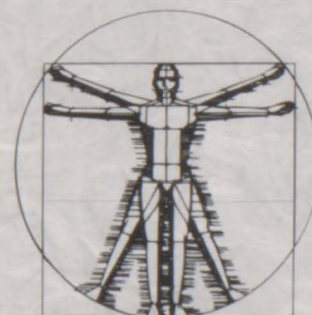

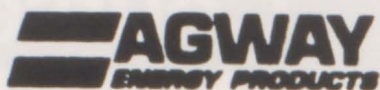
