Drama students know that everyone has their own unique way of "getting into their part" as they concentrate on perfecting their roles.






SADD's mission simply stated is:

To provide students with the best prevention and intervention tools possible to deal with the issues of underage drinking, drunk driving, drug abuse and other destructive decisions.




Drama Club




This years Varsity Volleyball demonstarted what it takes to be a champion. After a rought start the team pulled together to finish the regular season with an over all 13-6 record,
