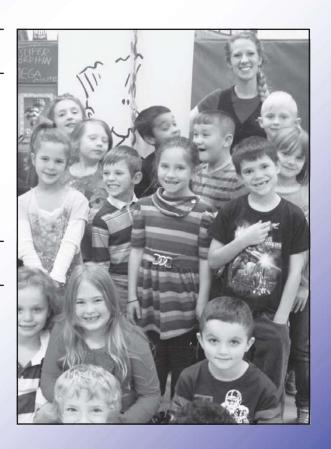

The enclosed information details your Board of Education's proposed 2014-2015 spending plan. After two years of drastic cuts we are pleased to be able to offer you a plan that increases staffing and provides students with both college and *career ready* programming opportunities. We look forward to extending our relationship with community businesses through internships and job shadowing experiences while at the same time providing some of our graduates with the opportunity to earn an Associate's Degree while still in high school.

The goal of the Board of Education is to maintain our tradition of academic and extra-curricular excellence while providing our community with a reasonable tax levy in these challenging fiscal times. With the cooperation of all of our bargaining units we have been able to switch our District health insurance provider. This switch has allowed us to come to long term contract agreements with all of our groups, which has provided needed stability in budget forecasting and development. With a commitment to multi-year planning and the discipline to support and grow our programs within our financial means, we should remain fiscally stable for the next several years.

Bainbridge-Guilford is still one of the New York state school Districts most affected by the gap elimination adjustment. Like many of you who are in the private sector or who are self-employed, our District has had to change the way we operate both from a financial and attitudinal perspective. We are proud that our people have risen to the challenge of higher professional expectations and we appreciate the support from our community as we try to model the behaviors and actions necessary for success in an ever-changing global world.

OVERVIEW OF MAJOR PROGRAM CHANGES

In developing the proposed budget, the district was able to retain all current programs and positions. Additionally, the district was able to restore or enhance some programs that were eliminated or diminished over the last couple years as the district has dealt with the impact of the "Gap Elimination Adjustment" also known as the "GEA".

The overall budget reflects an increase of 4.99% in estimated total expenditures next year.

The following is a summary of the major program changes reflected in the proposed budget. The changes are designed to enhance opportunities for B-G students.

Elementary	Two new elementary teaching positions to address enrollment at the 2nd and 4th grade levels. Additionally, an existing .8 (part time) elementary position will be increased to a full time position at the elementary level.
High School	One new Math position and an increase of a .8 (part time) position to full time to enhance achievement in our mathematics program. One new Physical Education position to address student safety and enhance program options.
Technology	In the current year, the district commenced a new Business Manufacturing Technology class that has been a tremendous success. Plans are currently underway to enhance this program in an effort to provide more practical skills training for our students.
Athletics	Reinstatement of a number of Junior Varsity teams including Baseball, Softball, Girls Volleyball, and Wrestling. Reinstatement of the Varsity Tennis team.

HOW WILL THE BUDGET AFFECT MY TAXES?

The calculated Tax Levy Limit (Tax Cap) for our school district is 1.8% for the 2014-15 school year. The proposed budget adopted by the Board of Education results in a tax levy increase that is within this limit. Therefore, qualifying district residents may be eligible for the new Property Tax Freeze. This new legislation effectively freezes property taxes on the primary residences of homeowners with annual incomes at or less than \$500,000 in school districts that stay within the property tax cap.

The chart below is intended to show an estimate of projected tax increases for homes of different assessed values. These are the estimated amounts prior to any refund by the state for qualifying residential properties under the state Property Tax Freeze program.

Actual tax rates are affected by many factors beyond the school district's control such as Assessed Values, State Equalization Rates, and STAR Exemptions. Actual tax rates will not be set until sometime in August when the state finalizes equalization rates for each of our district's ten townships. The following chart simply displays the amount of a 1.8% increase on varying levels of hypothetical assessed values at Full Market Value.

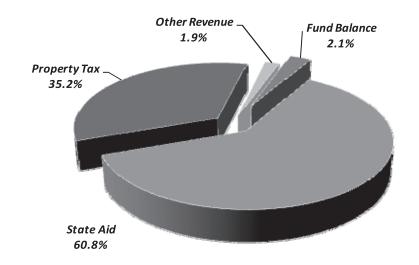

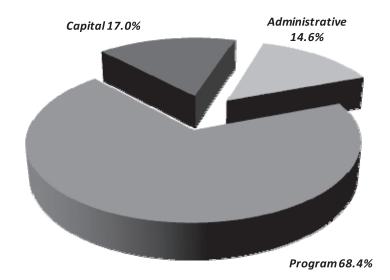

Proposed School Budget

Residents will have the opportunity to vote on the proposed school budget as outlined in this document. An opportunity to learn more about the proposed budget will be provided at our Public Budget Hearing which will be held in the High School Auditorium on Tuesday, May 13, 2014 starting at 7:00 PM. Proposition to Finance School Bus Purchases

Voters will be presented with a proposition to borrow an amount not to exceed \$275,684 for the replacement of three school buses. The district intends to purchase two full size propane powered buses for regular bus runs and one smaller bus for specialized runs with fewer passengers. In addition to the environmental advantages of the propane powered buses, we have found that the propane vehicles are saving approximately \$4,000 each per year in lower operating costs. The district intends to finance the buses over a period of five years with a Bond Anticipation Note. The principal and interest payments are eligible for Transportation Aid from New York State which could be as high as 90% of the cost. The replacement of these vehicles will help the school district to maintain a cost effective and safe fleet for the children that we transport throughout our 100 square mile school district.

Election of School Board Members

Residents will have the opportunity to vote for candidates seeking to fill two Board of Education terms. The terms of office will be for three years. The seats are currently held by members Patrick McElligott and Jeanne Shields respectively. The elections are held at-large. The two successful candidates will commence their terms of office on July 1, 2014.

There are two Board of Education terms that will expire on June 30, 2014. The following individuals have submitted petitions to fill the expiring seats on the Board of Education. 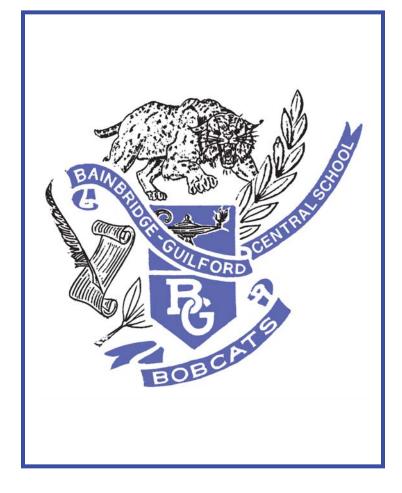

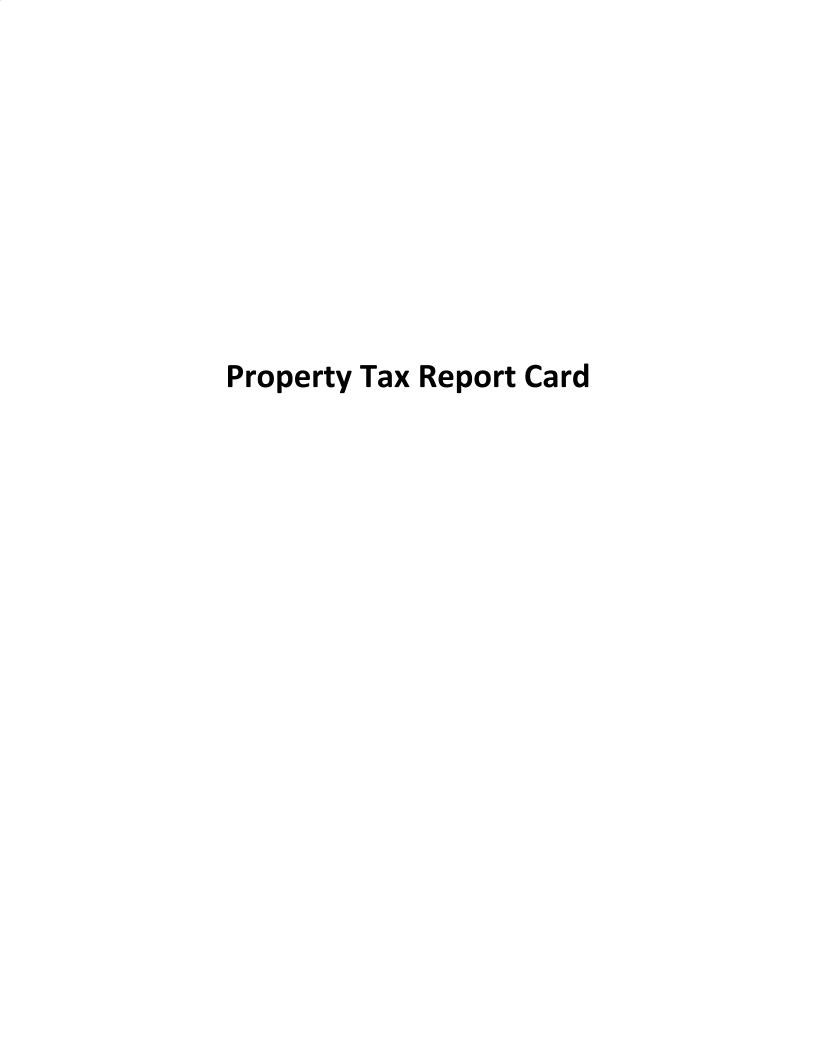
Qualifications of Voters

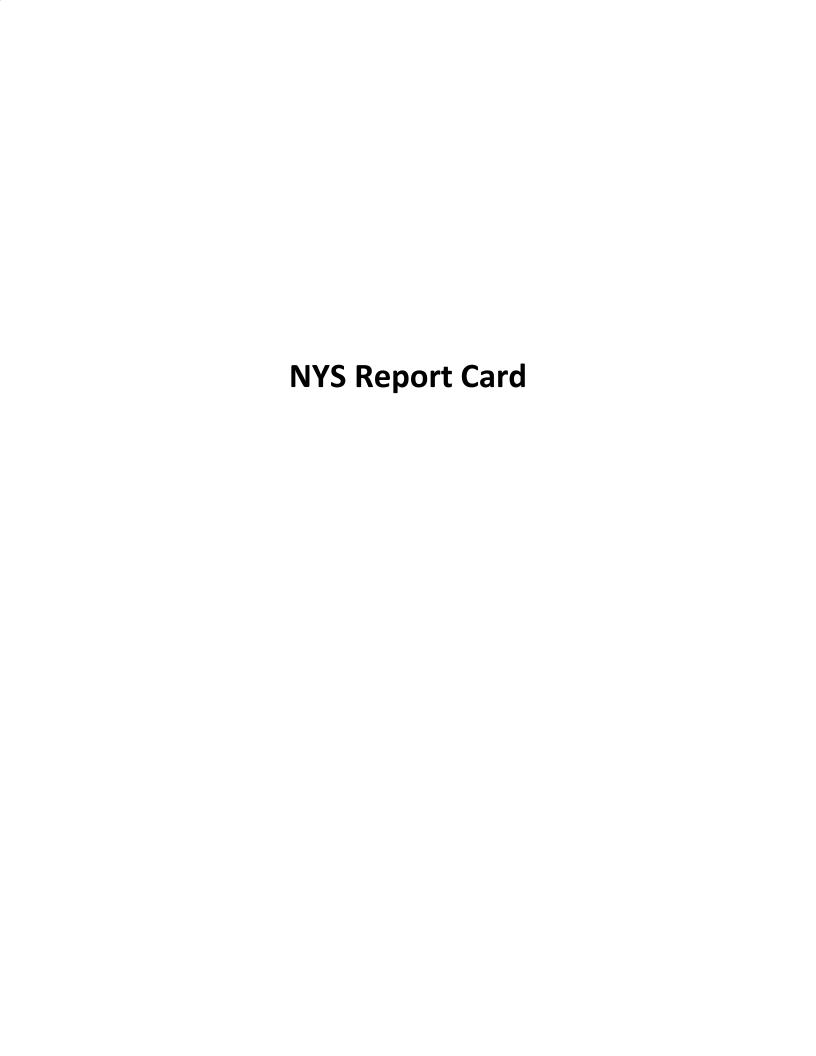

Demographic Factors Information

Teacher Qualifications Information

The Percent Teaching Out of Certification for public schools is the percent doing so on more than an incidental basis; that is, the percent teaching for more than five periods per week outside certification.

Core Classes are primarily K–6 common branch, English, mathematics, science, social studies, art, music, and foreign languages. To be Highly Qualified, a teacher must have at least a Bachelor's degree, be certified to teach in the subject area or otherwise in accordance with state standards, and show subject matter competency.

In public schools, a teacher who taught one class outside of the certification area(s) is counted as *Highly Qualified* provided that 1) the teacher had been determined by the school or district through the HOUSSE process or other state-accepted methods to have demonstrated acceptable subject knowledge and teaching skills and 2) the class in question was not the sole assignment reported. Credit for incidental teaching does not extend beyond a single assignment. Independent of *Highly Qualified Teacher* status, any assignment for which a teacher did not hold a valid certificate still registers as teaching out of certification.

In charter schools, a teacher is counted as *Highly Qualified* if the teacher has at least a Bachelor's degree, is certified to teach, and shows subject matter competency. Enabling legislation considers charter school teachers to be certified if they hold any valid teaching certificate. Enabling legislation also permits up to 30 percent (with a maximum of five) of charter school teachers to be without certification and to be considered *Highly Qualified* if they meet all remaining criteria.

High-poverty and low-poverty schools are those schools in the upper and lower quartiles, respectively, for percentage of students eligible for a free or reduced-price lunch.

Teacher Turnover Rate Information

Teacher Turnover Rate for a specified school year is the number of teachers in that school year who were not teaching in the following school year divided by the number of teachers in the specified school year, expressed as a percentage.

Staff Counts Information

New York State Alternate Assessment (NYSAA)

The New York State Alternate Assessments are administered in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics to ungraded students with severe cognitive disabilities whose ages are equivalent to graded students in grades 3 through 8 and secondary level. They are administered in science to students with disabilities age equivalent to graded students in grades 4, 8, and secondary level. And they are administered in social studies at the secondary level only.

New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Tests (NYSESLAT)

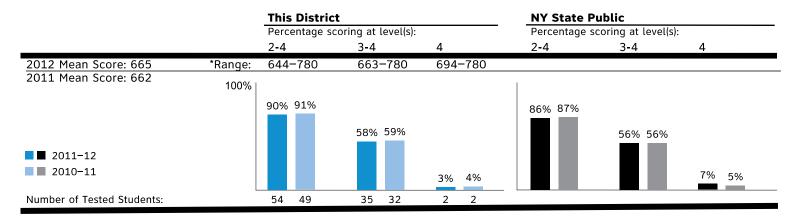
The New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Tests are administered in grades K through 12 to limited English proficient students.

Secondary-Level Cohorts

A secondary-level cohort consists of all students who first entered grade 9 anywhere or, in the case of ungraded students with disabilities, reached their seventeenth birthday in a particular year. The 2008 cohort consists of all students who first entered grade 9 anywhere or, in the case of ungraded students with disabilities, reached their seventeenth birthday between July 1, 2008 and June 30, 2009. The 2007 cohort consists of all students who first entered grade 9 anywhere or, in the case of ungraded students with disabilities, reached their seventeenth birthday between July 1, 2007 and June 30, 2008. Adequate Yearly Progress and Performance Indices

Performance Indices (PIs) and Unweighted Combined PIs are used to determine if a district or school is Priority or Focus. Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) for accountability groups (all students, racial/ethnic groups, students with disabilities, limited English proficient students, and economically disadvantaged students) and PIs for accountability groups and non-AYP groups (non-racial/ethnic groups, general-education students, English proficient students, not economically disadvantaged students, male and female students, and migrant and non-migrant students) are used to determine if a district or school is Reward or a school requires a Local Assistance Plan. Adequate Yearly Progress

In accordance with federal and State laws, the New York State Education Department must determine and report on the performance of students in the following areas:

- 1) Elementary/middle-level (grades 3 8) English Language Arts (ELA)
- 2) Elementary/middle-level (grades 3 8) Mathematics
- 3) Elementary/middle-level (grades 4 and 8) Science
- 4) Secondary-level (grades 9-12) ELA
- 5) Secondary-level (grades 9-12) Mathematics
- 6) Graduation Rate

This performance is determined by identifying whether or not a district or school made "Adequate Yearly Progress" (AYP). AYP indicates satisfactory progress by a district or a school toward the goal of proficiency for all students. In ELA, mathematics, and science, AYP is determined by comparing the percentage of students tested and the performance of tested students against defined standards. In graduation rate, AYP is determined by comparing the percentage of students graduating against defined standards.

Standards for English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science

Participation: In ELA and mathematics, 95% of students in each accountability group with 40 or more members must be tested to meet the participation criterion. In science, 80% must be tested.

Performance: In ELA and mathematics, a calculated measure of performance called the "**Performance Index**" (PI) for each accountability group with 30 or more members must equal or exceed a preset objective called an "**Effective Annual Measurable Objective**" (EAMO) or a safety net objective called a "**Safe Harbor Target.**" In science, the criterion for performance is the same but the safety net is referred to as a "**Progress Target.**"

Districts and schools must meet both the participation and performance criteria for all groups with sufficient numbers to make AYP.

Standards for Graduation Rate

Districts and schools with secondary-level grades are also held to certain standards for the percentage of students who graduated. To make AYP in graduation rate, every accountability group with 30 or more members must make AYP. For a group to make AYP, the graduation rate of the 4-year graduation-rate total cohort or the 5-year graduation-rate total cohort must equal or exceed the Graduation-Rate Standard of 80% or the group's Progress Target. A cohort is a group of students who entered grade 9 anywhere in a particular school year. Graduation rates for these cohorts are then determined 4 and 5 years after the students first enter grade 9.

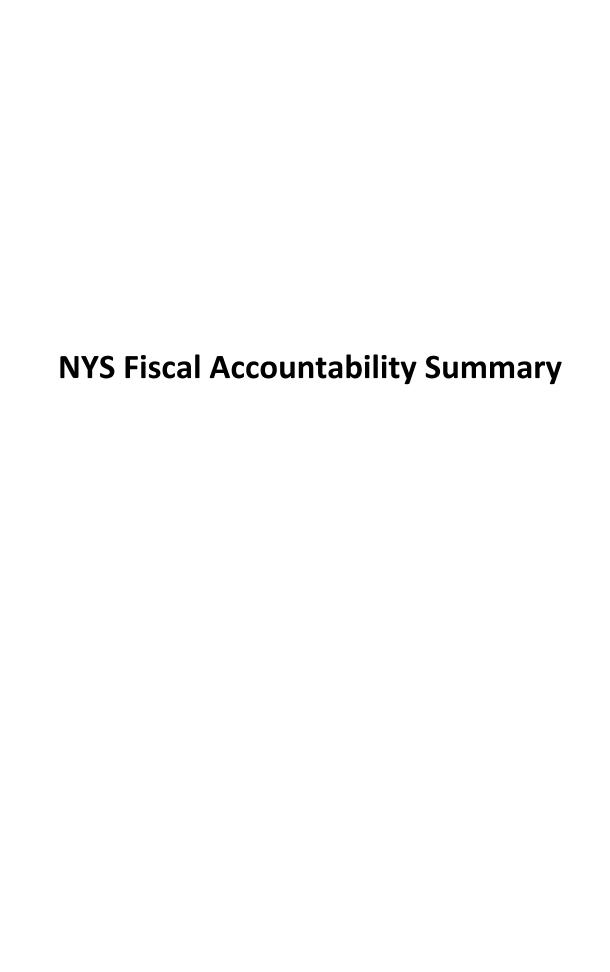

Pupils resident in the district but attending a charter school are included. For districts in which a county jail is located, this number includes incarcerated youth to whom the district must provide an education program.

Instructional Expenditures for Special Education are K-12 expenditures for students with disabilities (including summer special education expenditures) plus a proration of building-level administrative and instructional support expenditures. District expenditures, such as transportation, debt service and district-wide administration are not included.

The pupil count for Special Education is a count of K-12 students with disabilities for the 2011-12 school year plus students for whom the district receives tuition from another district plus students for whom the district pays tuition to another district. Students attending the State schools at Rome and Batavia, private placements and out-of-state placements are included.

Instructional Expenditures Per Pupil is the simple arithmetic ratio of Instructional Expenditures to Pupils. The total cost of instruction for students with disabilities may include both general- and special-education expenditures. 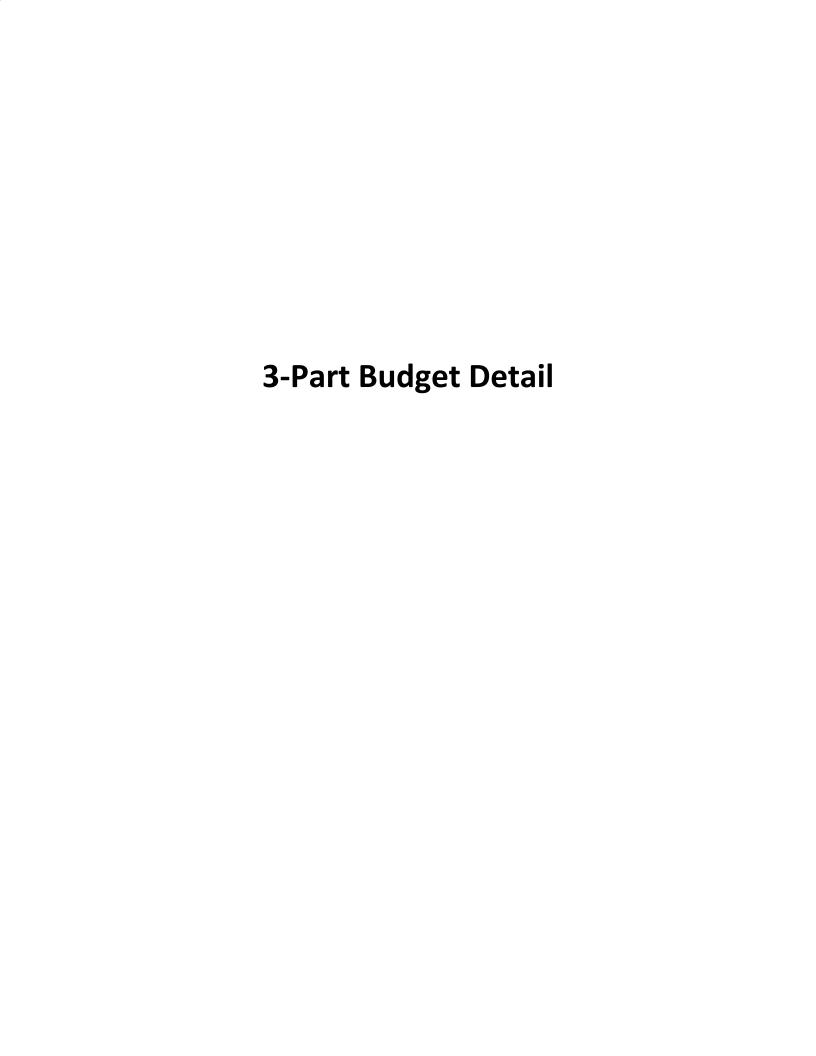

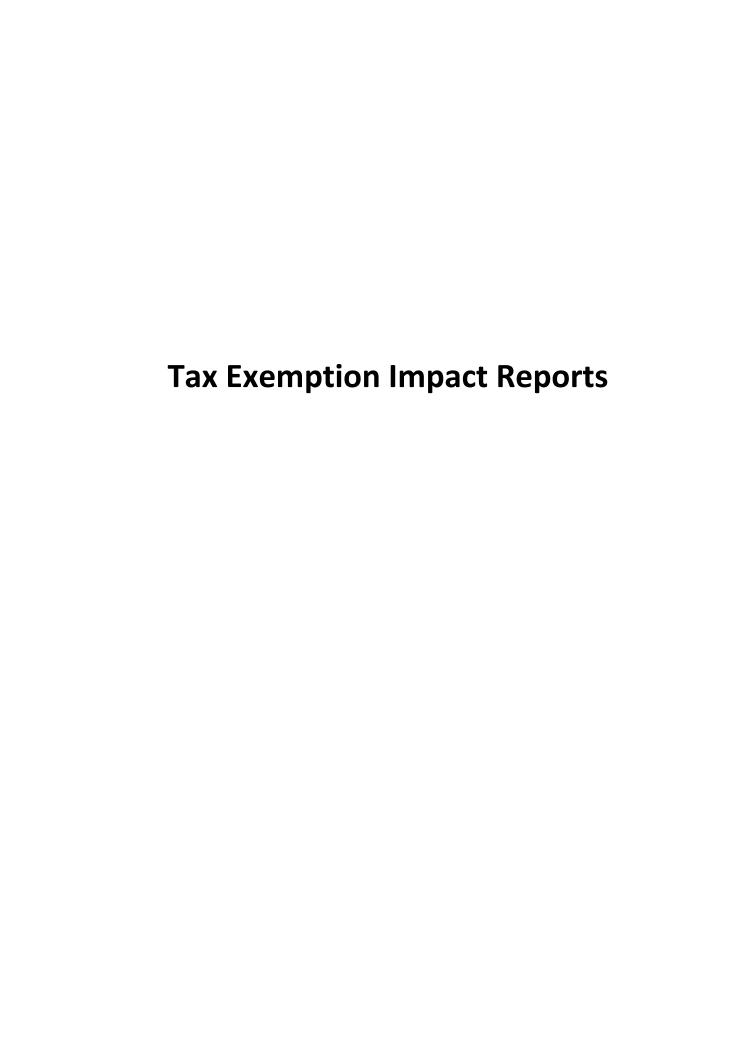

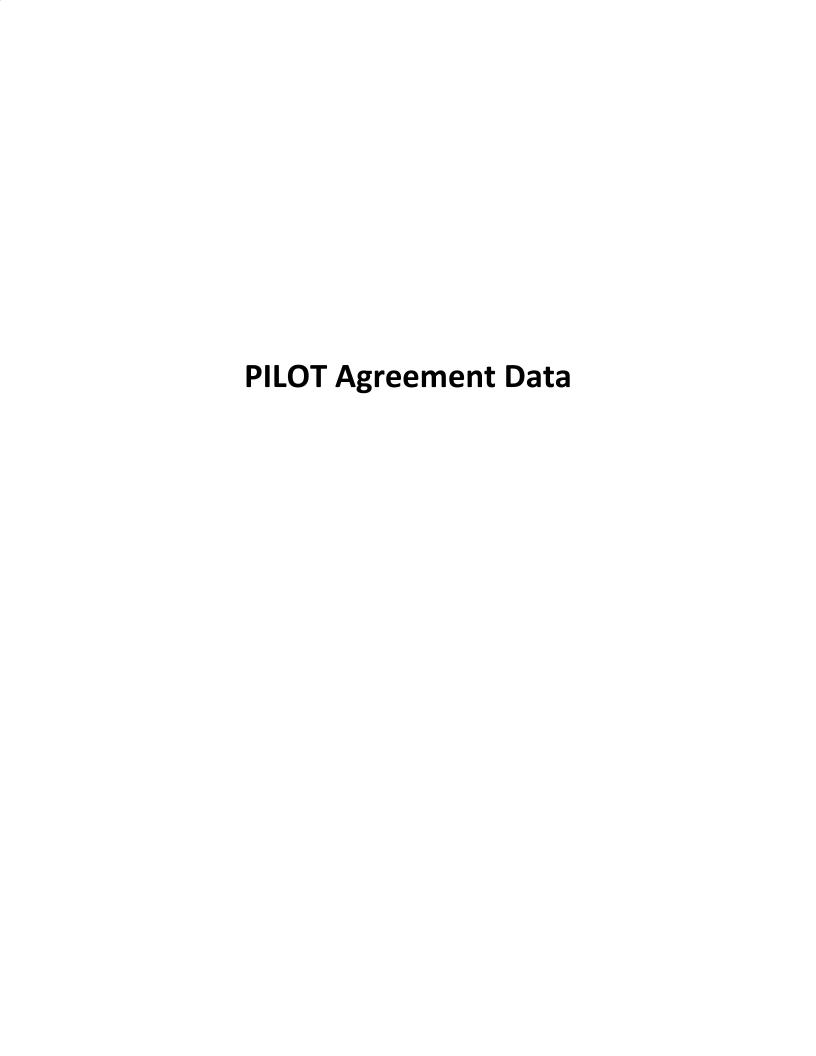
