CONCLUSION

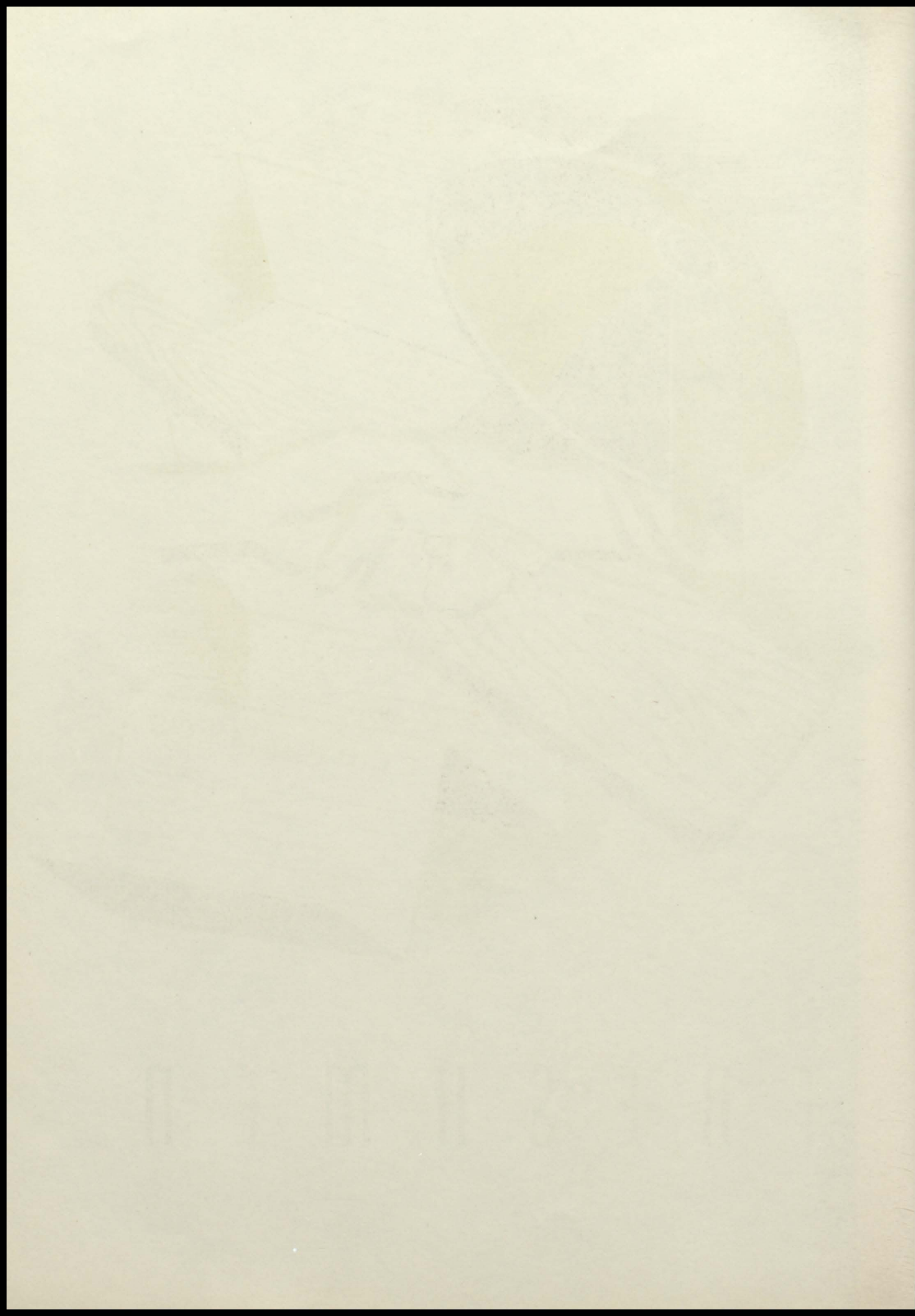
