 Fond memories of Guilford High.



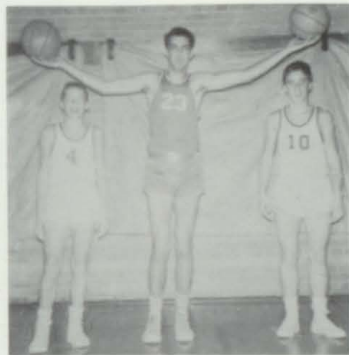
