FREE, LOW-COST OR DISCOUNTED MEDICATIONS!

Getting the medicines you need is important for your health and well being. If you cannot afford them, your illness could worsen and become more difficult to treat.



Are you unable to pay for the medications you need to manage your health due to:

- Low income and high costs of medicines?
- Lack of healthcare insurance or prescription drug coverage?

If you answered yes to one or both of these questions, one of the programs listed in this guide may be able to help. These programs offer free, low-cost or discounted medications.

However, the first step is to tell your doctor that you are having trouble obtaining medications.



There are four programs that provide assistance with affording medications:

- Prescription Assistance Programs
- Discount Card Programs
- Local Pharmacy Discount Programs
- Discount Mail-Order Programs

You can participate in more than one type of program. Use this guide to help find the program that is right for you!

Long-term Medication Needs

Prescription Assistance Programs (PAPs)

PAPs are the best option for long-term maintenance medication needs. These are programs that offer free medicines for individuals or families who may or may not have health insurance or prescription drug coverage. However, these programs have income requirements that applicants must meet in order to qualify.*

Discount Cards

Discount card programs are an option for short-term maintenance medication needs. These programs provide discounts of 30%-50% off generic medications and do not have any income requirements. You may enroll in more than one program, however, check with your pharmacist about which card gives you the best discount.
